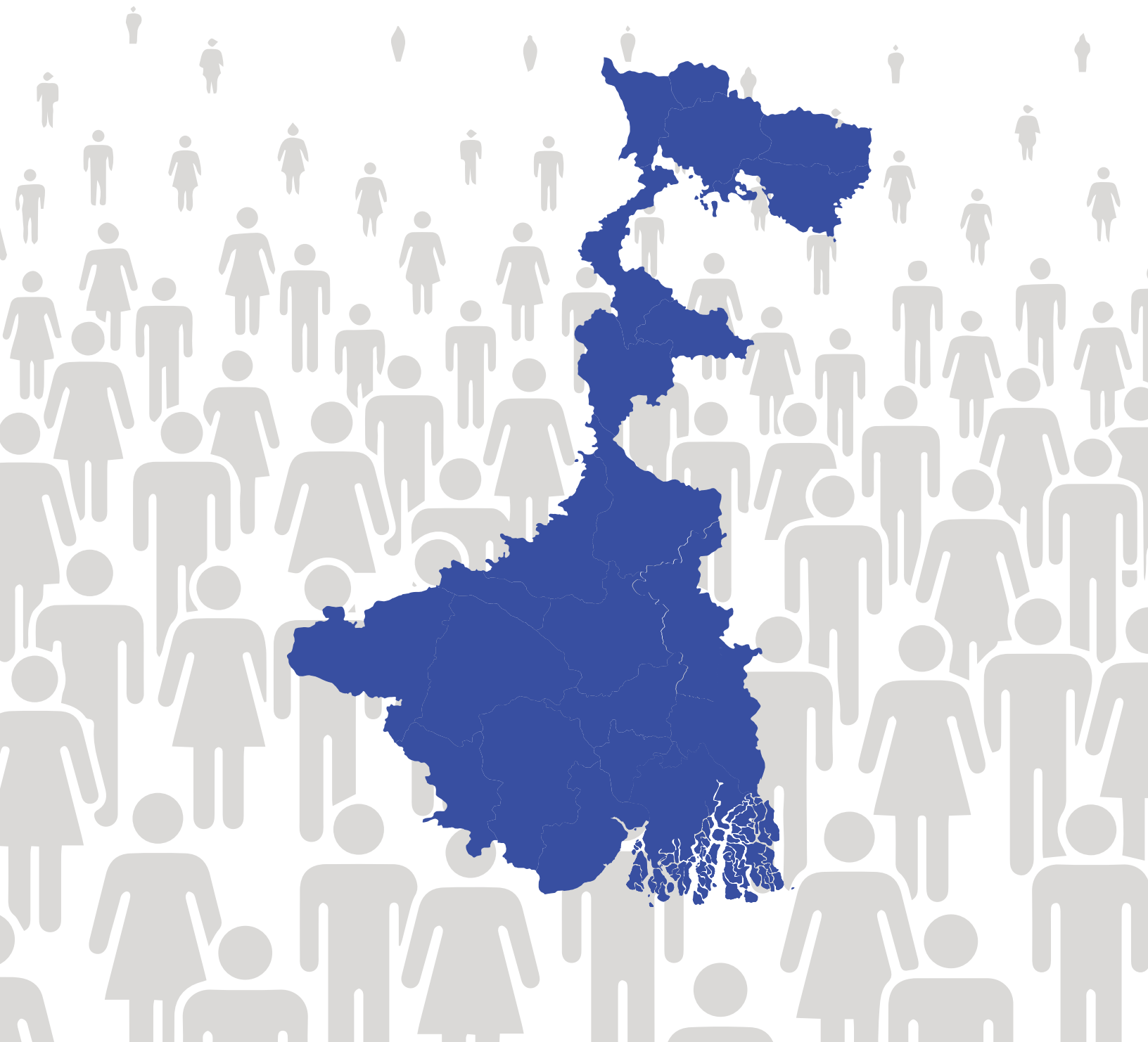

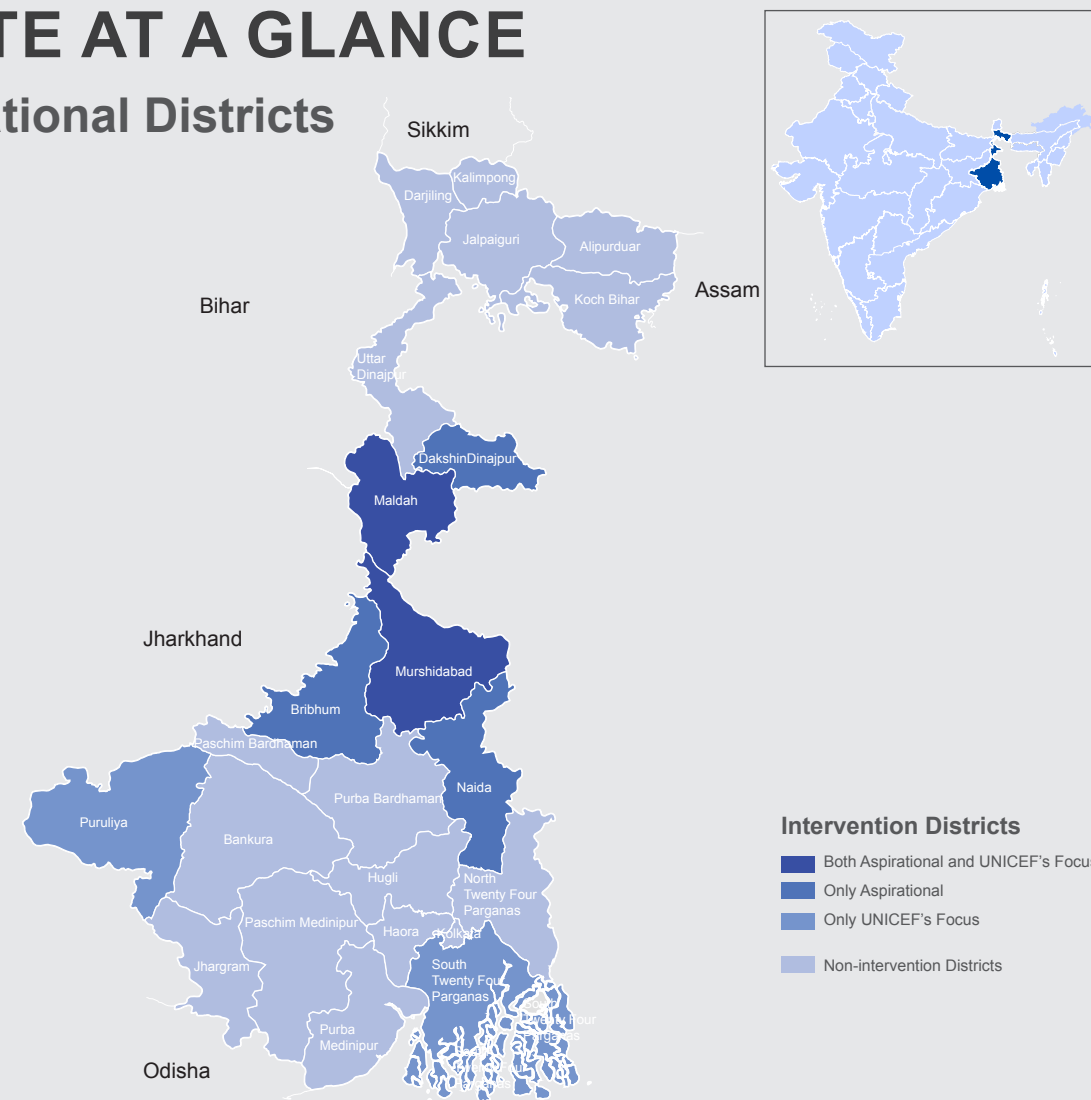

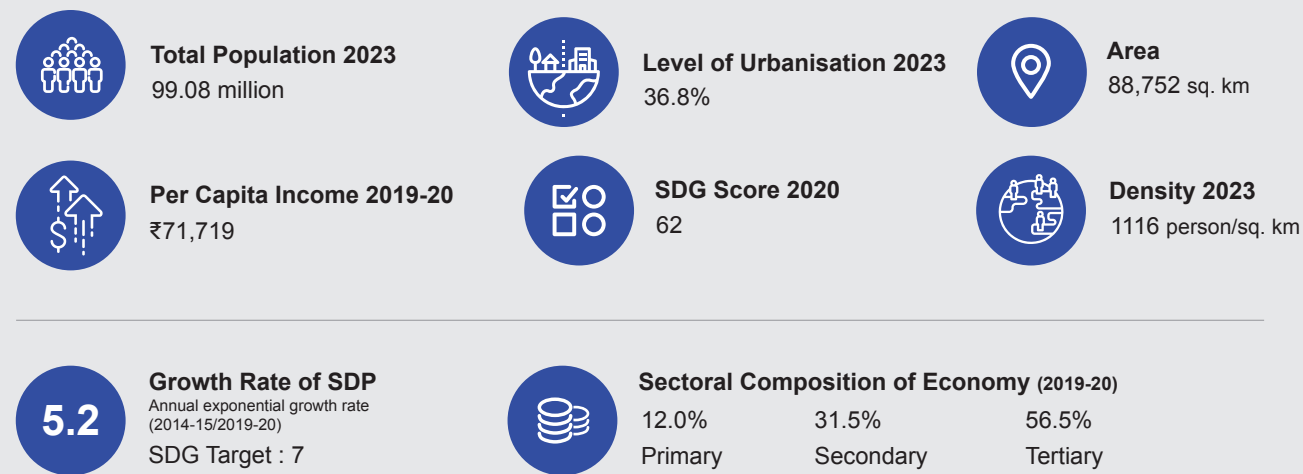

# HOW TO READ THE DOCUMENT

'Equity-based profile' is the most effective tool in understanding the nature and extent of inequity faced by a particular target group based on determinants such as economic condition, social group, religion, gender, and geographic region. It also helps to identify the laggard groups who need programmatic interventions.

This equity profile prepared by the National Institute of Urban Affairs, New Delhi will help its users to easily comprehend the as-is situation of West Bengal state and its comparison with all India. It also highlights the critical areas that require more inclusive policies and programme interventions.

### Structure of Equity Profile

The indicators in this profile are presented in eight sections. The first section illustrates the West Bengal state's demographic, social and economic characteristics. The following seven sections present indicators on the themes of Health, Nutrition, WASH, Education, Child Protection, Gender Equality and Social Protection. Each section has a set of indicators which are presented graphically, and the data has been drawn from secondary sources (for details, see link).

This profile also includes certain critical areas of vulnerabilities which are specific to the West Bengal state. These have been identified based on a mixed approach (for details, see link).

### Equity Dimensions

Each of the indicators has been analysed through various equity lenses, as follows:

- Place of Residence: Rural and Urban
- Gender: Men and Women (>18 years), Boys and Girls (<18 years)
- Social Groups: Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST), Other Backward Classes (OBC) and Others
- Economic Categories: 1st Wealth Quintile (poorest) and 5th Wealth Quintile (richest)

### Reading the Infographics

The information in this profile is presented through infographics which makes it easy to understand and comprehend by all its users.

- Figures for 'India' and 'West Bengal' denote the average of respective geographies.
- Figures for 'Urban' and 'Rural' denote the average of West Bengal urban and rural areas respectively.
- Disaggregation by Gender (Boys/Men and Girls/Women) and Social Groups (SC, ST, OBC, Others) denotes average figures of West Bengal including both rural and urban areas.
- Figures for 1st Quintile denote the average of poorest people of West Bengal, including both rural and urban areas.
- Figures for 5th Quintile denote the average of richest people of West Bengal, including both rural and urban areas.
- Equity profile of each of the indicators pertains to the latest year available for their respective databases.
- SDG targets for a few indicators are given below the illustration to measure the distance from the goal.
- All figures are in percentage unless otherwise mentioned.
- Maps highlight inequalities at the district level within the state. They are not to scale and are indicative of geographic location only. Lighter shades represent better-performing districts and vice versa.

### Reading the Annexure

The annexure provides Equity Ratio between Urban and Rural areas; Men and Women; Scheduled Caste and Other; Scheduled Tribe and Others; Backward Class and Others; and 1st and 5th Wealth Quintile (for details, see link). Equity ratio <1 indicates that numerator has a lower value than denominator. Equity ratio >1 indicates denominator has a lower value than numerator. Equity ratio of 1 indicates there is equity between numerator and denominator and no disparity exists. Equity ratio of 0 indicates the numerator is 0. Equity ratio of '-' indicates either no value in numerator, no value in denominator, or no value in both numerator and denominator.

The equity ratios were calculated wherever data was available.

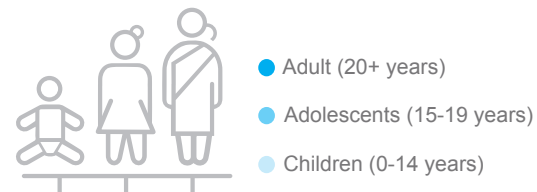

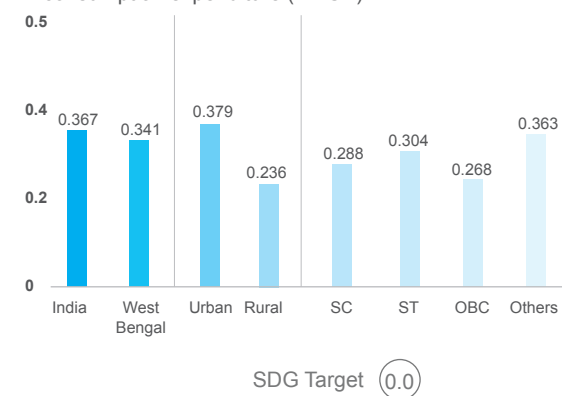
## Multidimensional Poverty (Headcount Ratio)

The Multidimensional Poverty Index prepared by NITI Aayog captures overlapping deprivations across 12 indicators



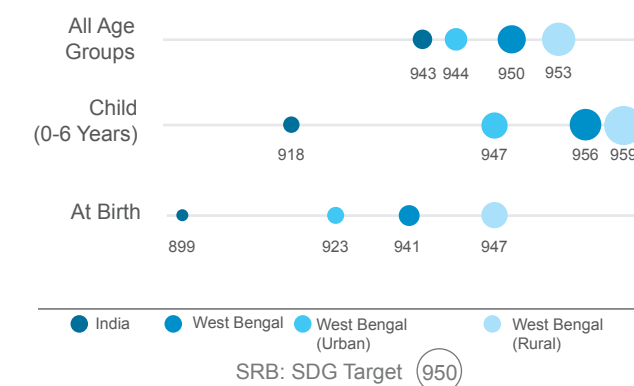

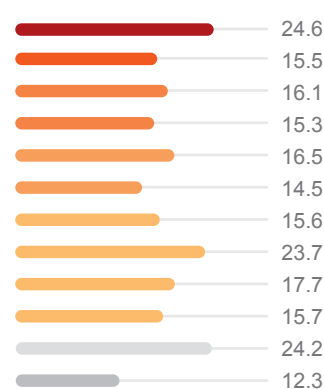

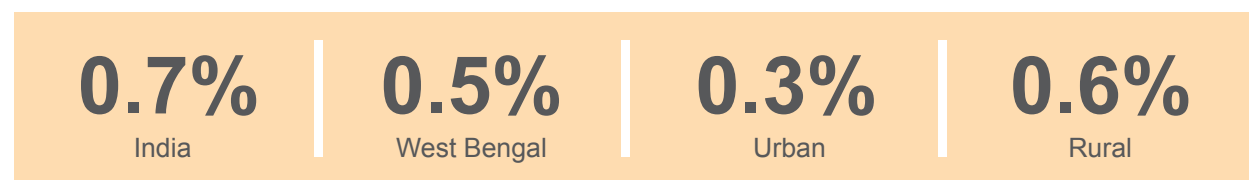
### Infant Mortality (0-11 Months)

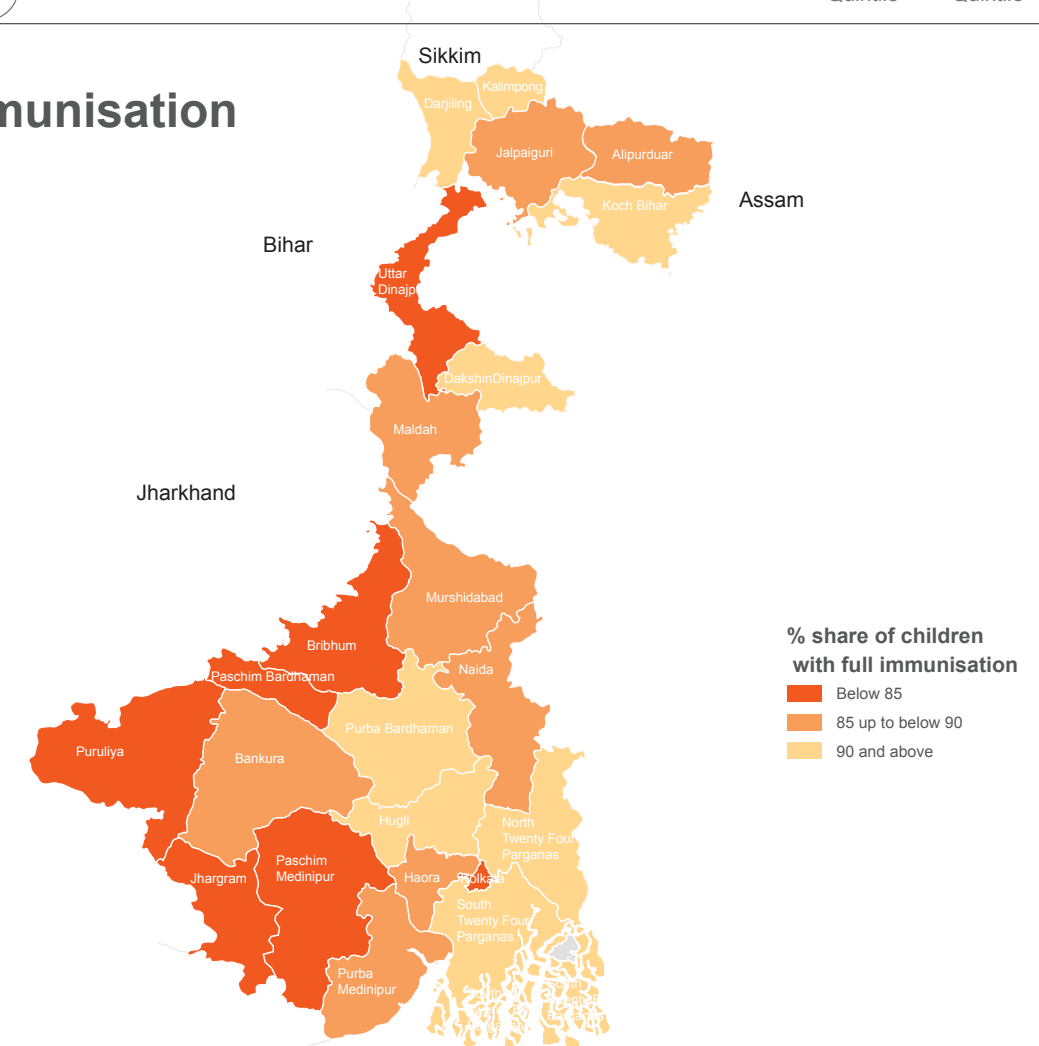

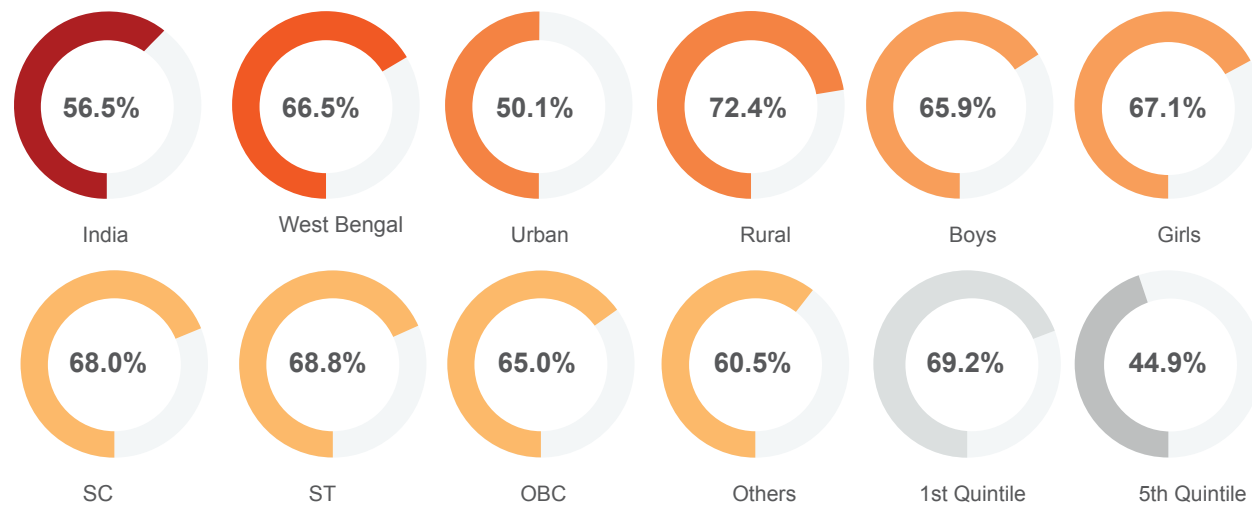

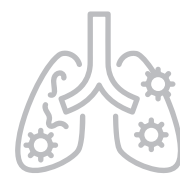
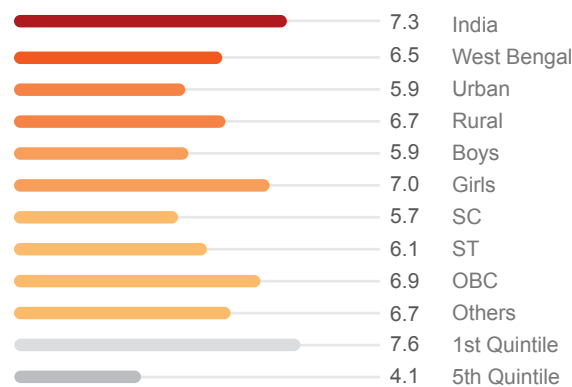

Percentage of living children under age 6 years who received health check-up at an anganwadi centre in the 12 months preceding the survey



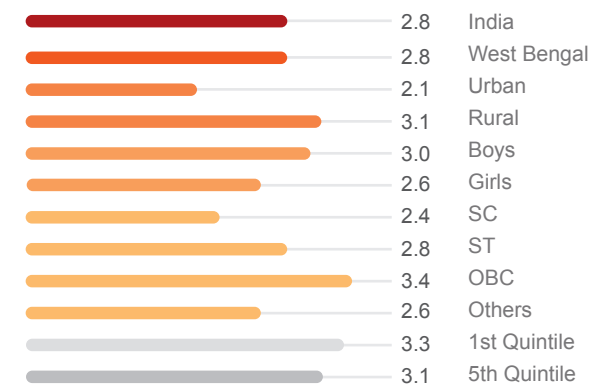
## Prevalence of Diarrhoea (0-59 Months)

Children under age 5 years with symptoms of ARI in the two weeks before the survey



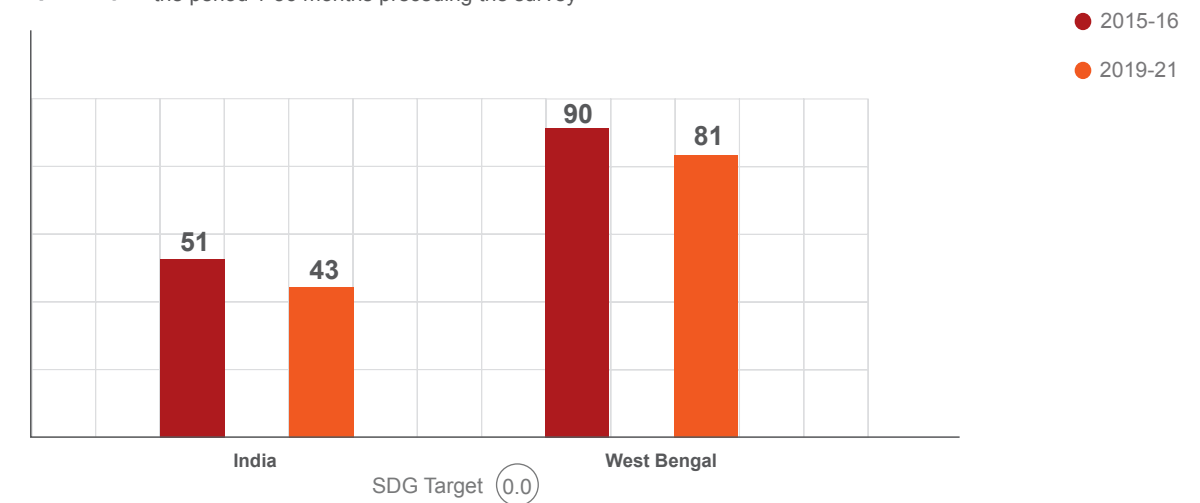

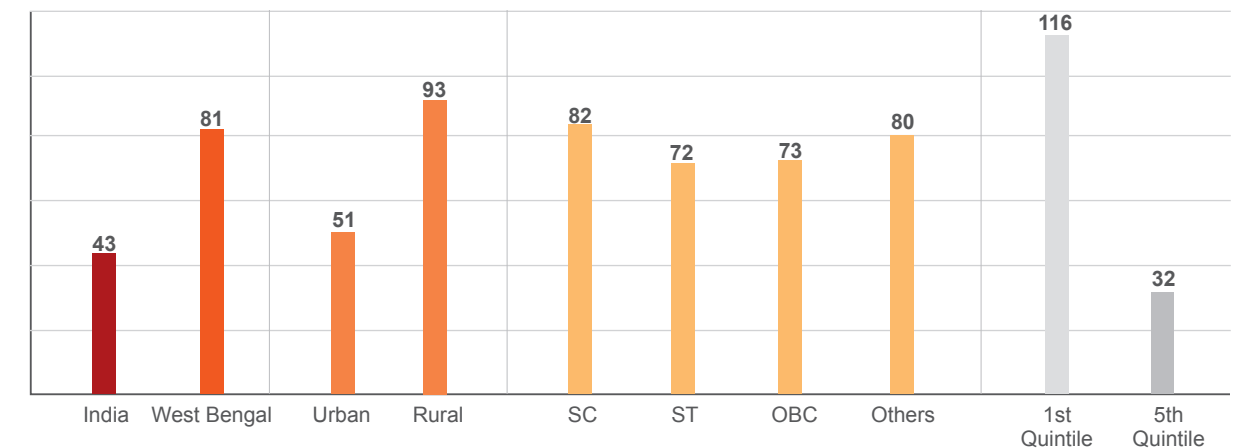


## Adolescent Fertility Rate (15-19 years)

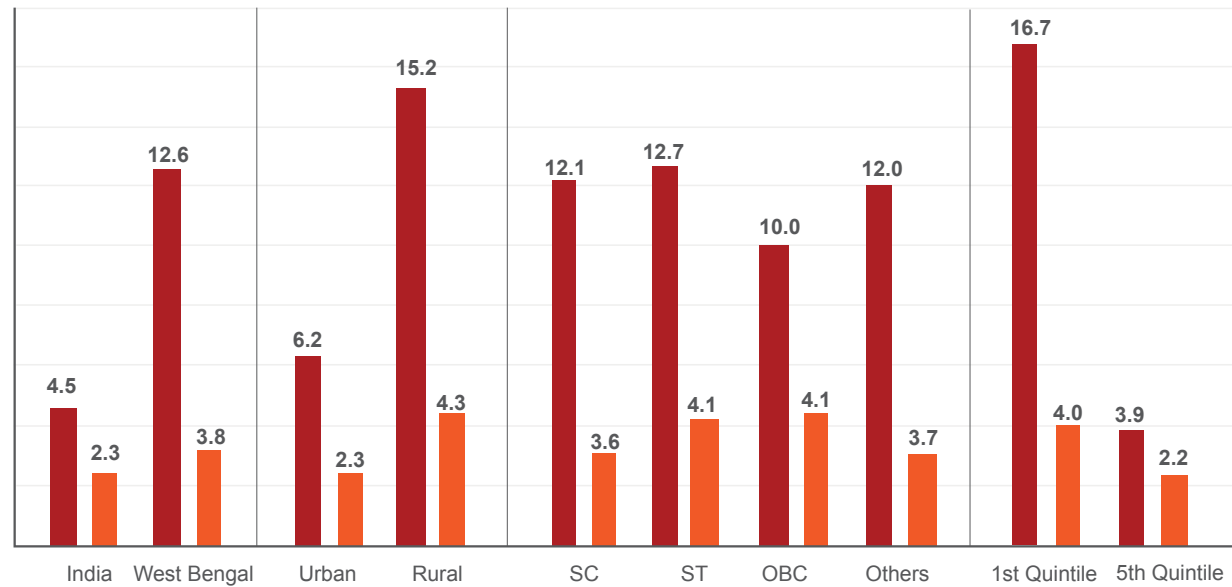

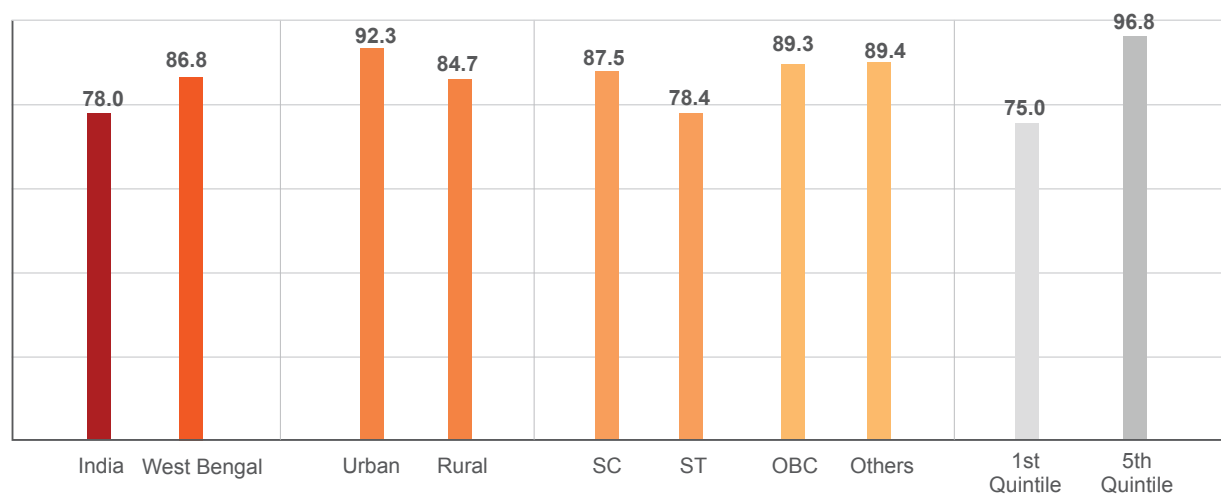

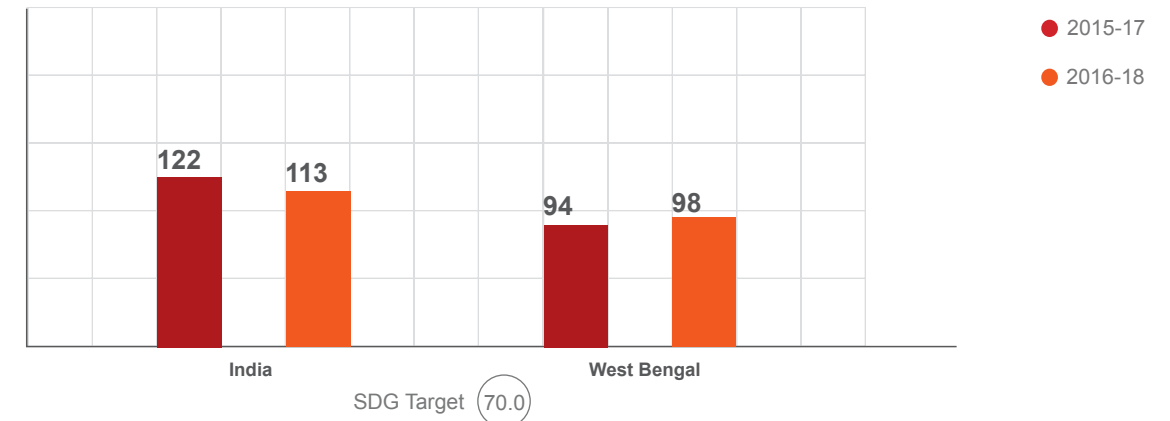

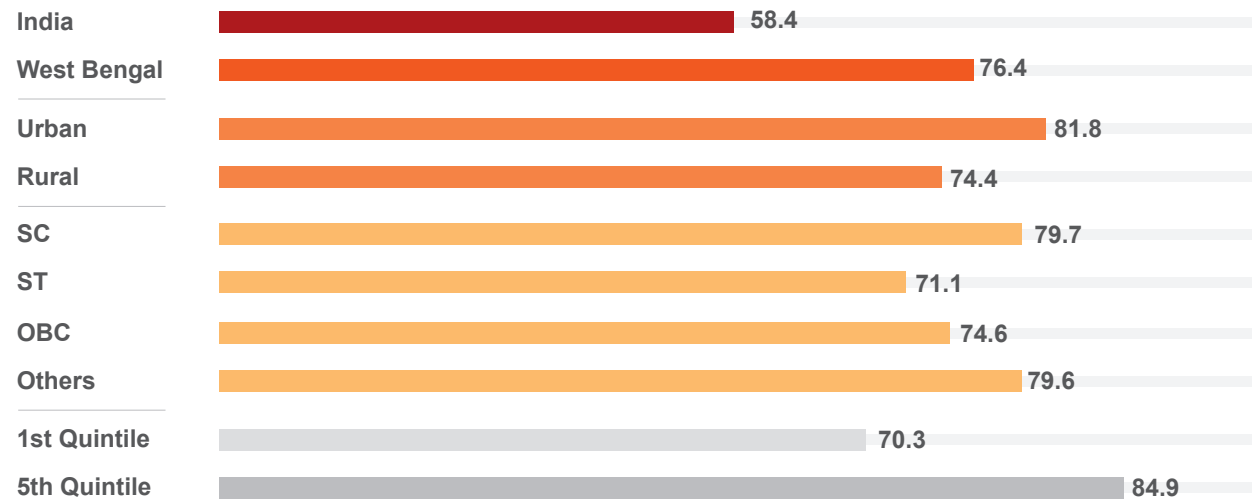

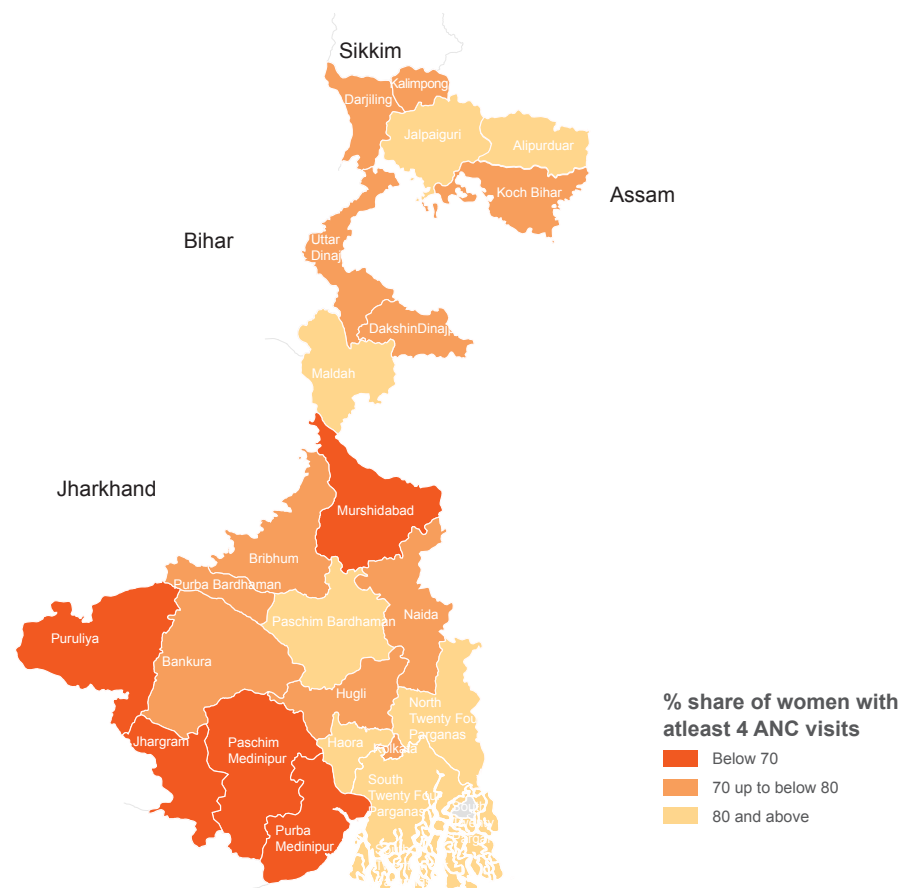
### Antenatal Care (ANC) Visits (15-49 Years)

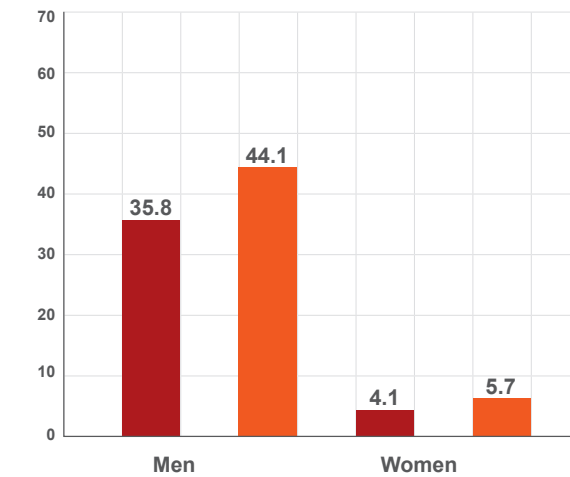

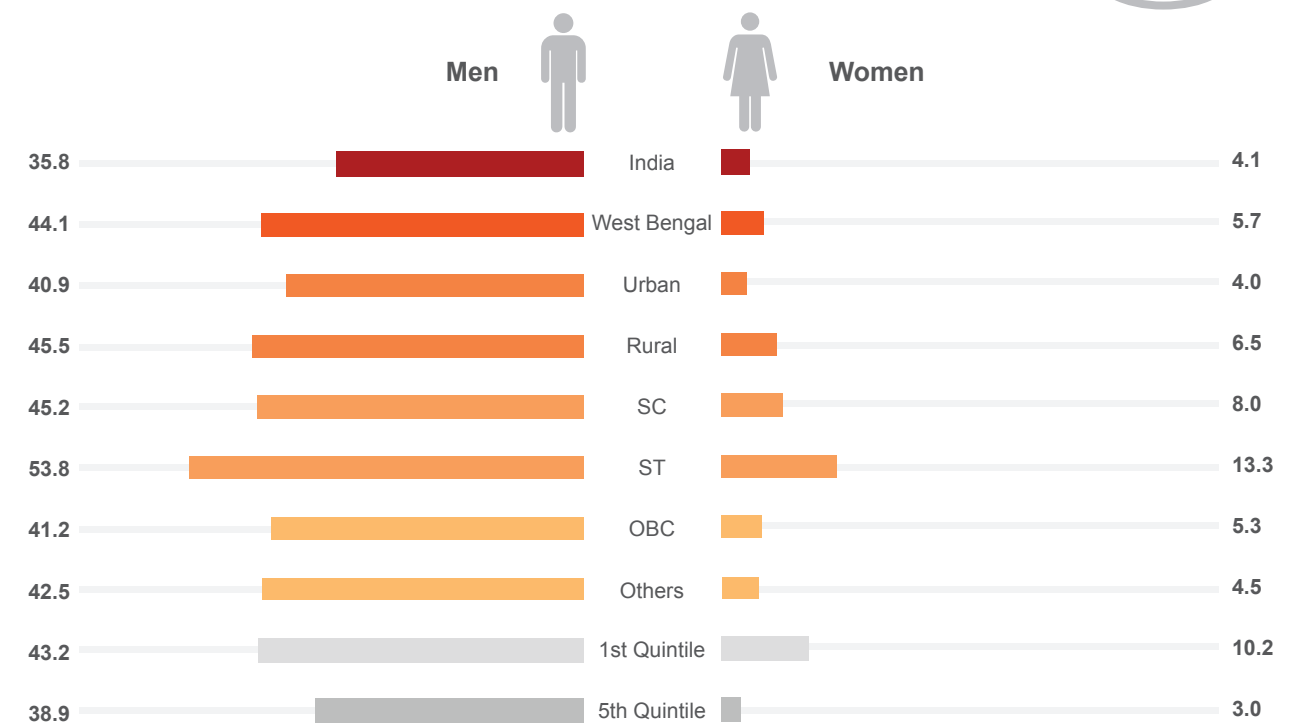

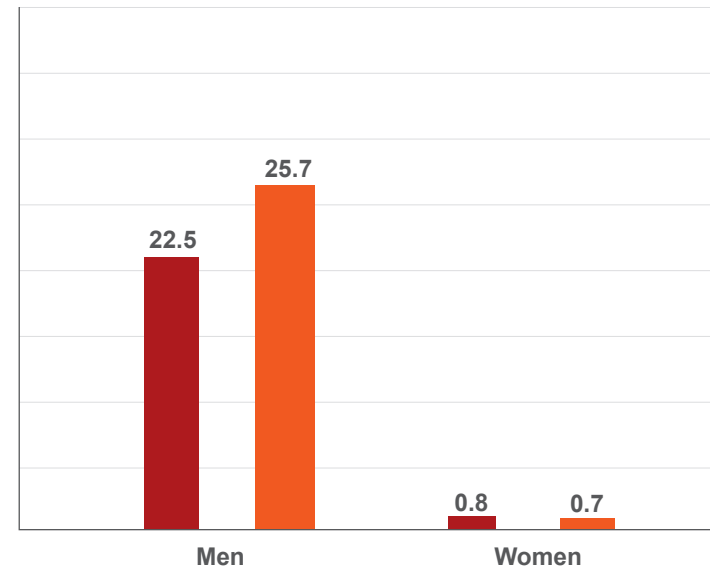

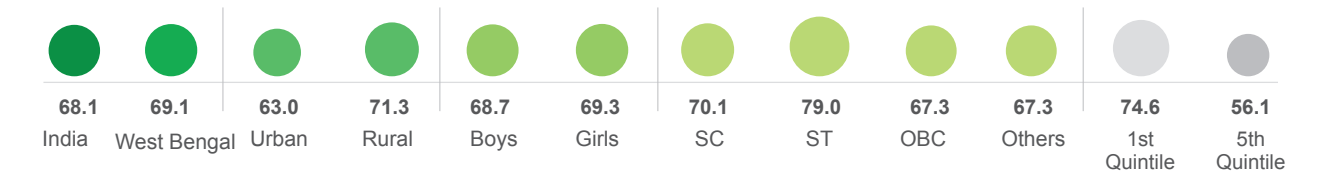

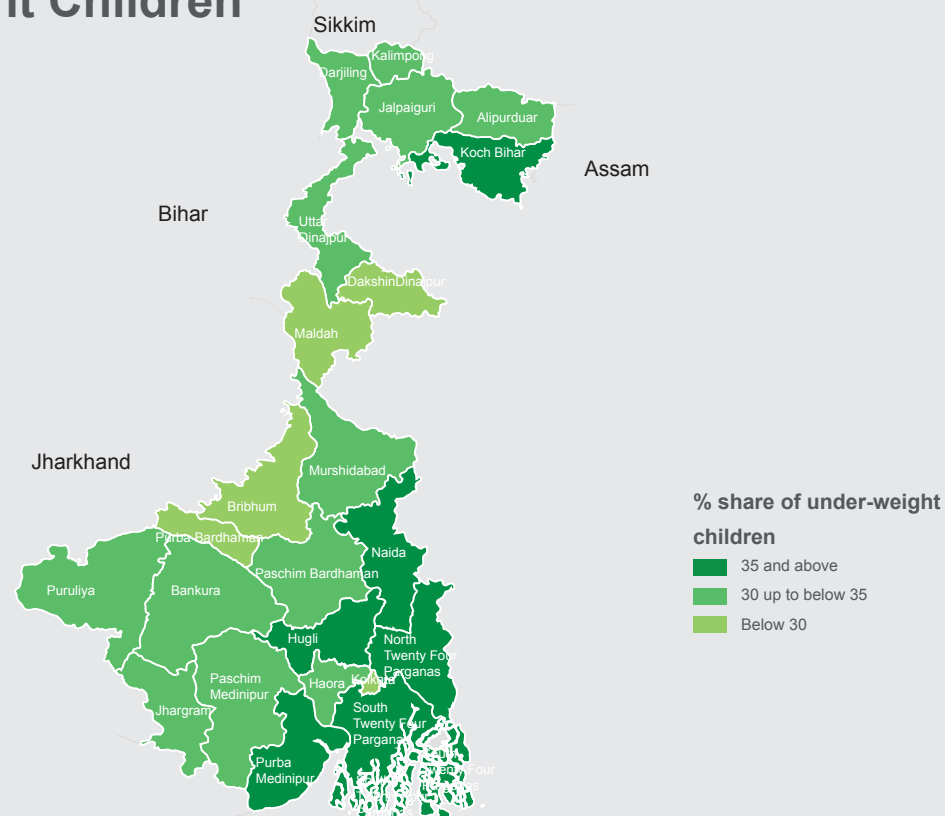

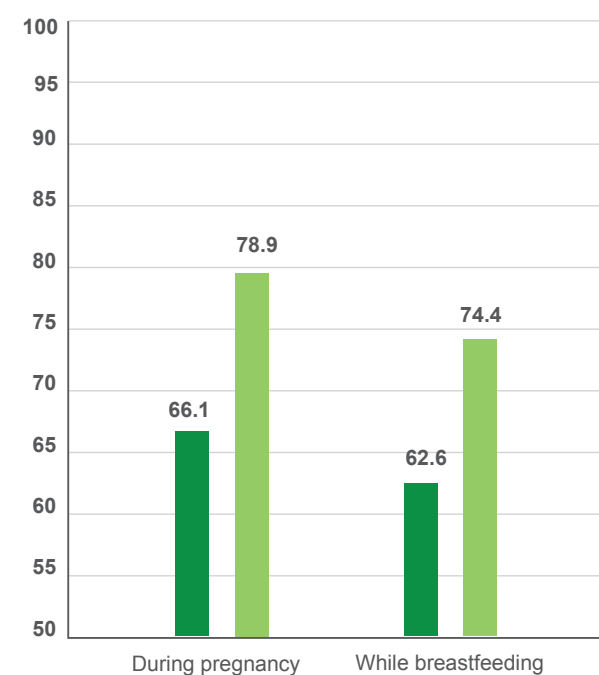
### Anaemia among Pregnant Women (15-49 years)

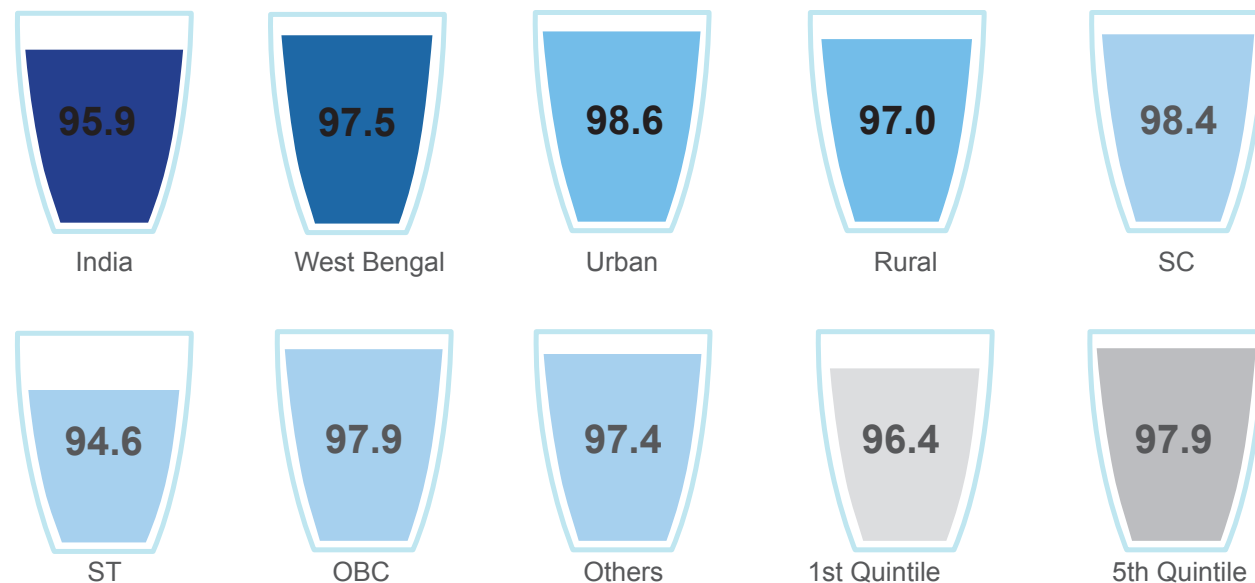

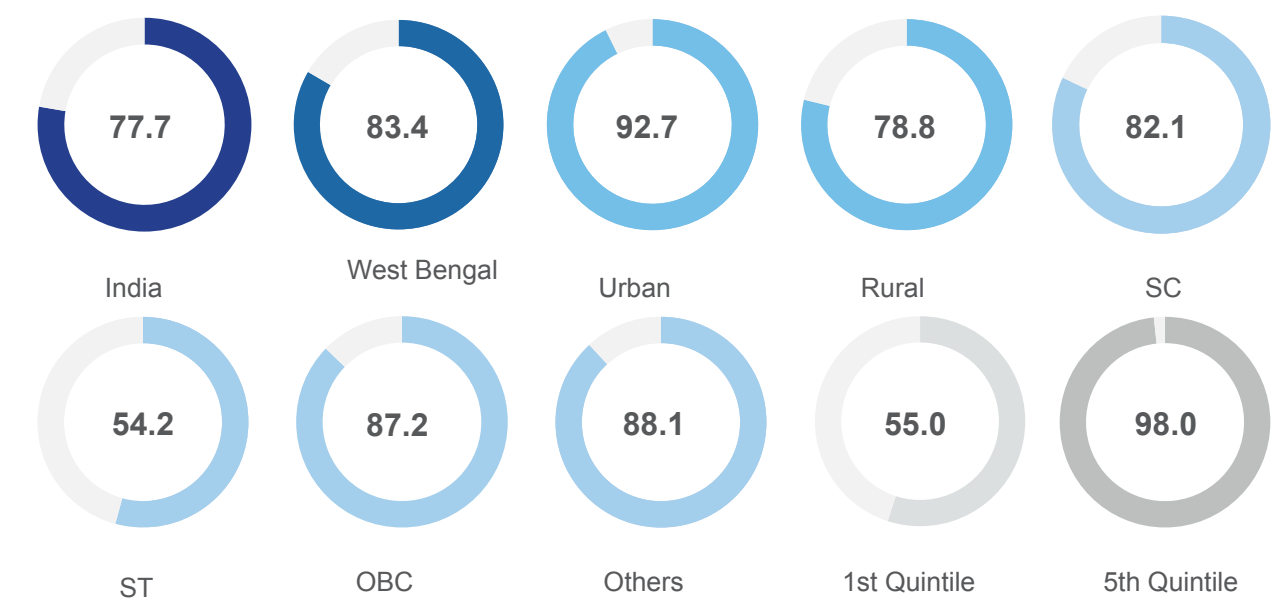

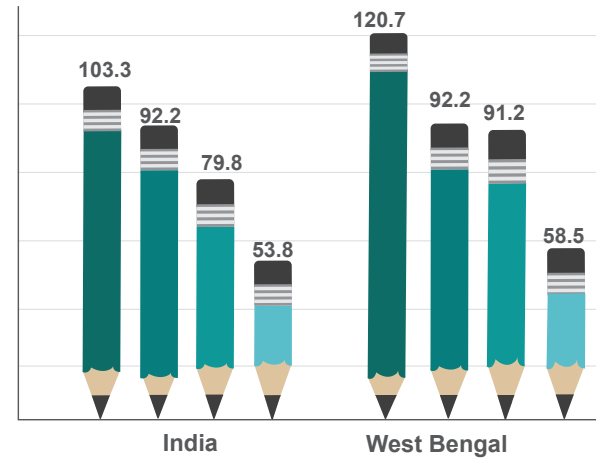

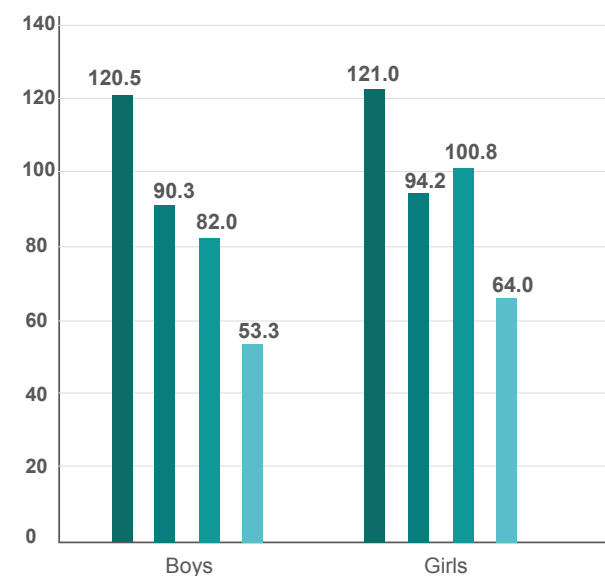

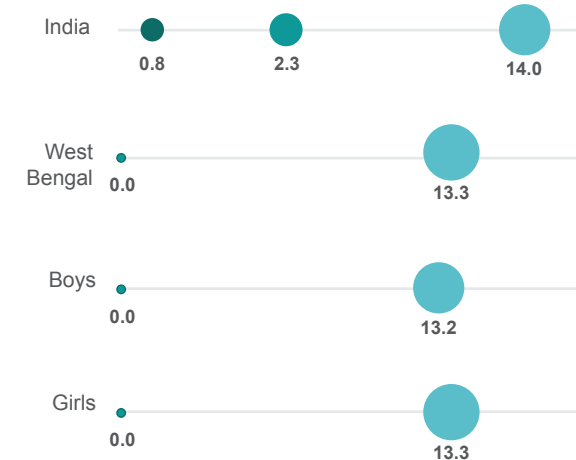
Gross enrolment ratio for gender disaggregation within the state at different educational levels in a reference year

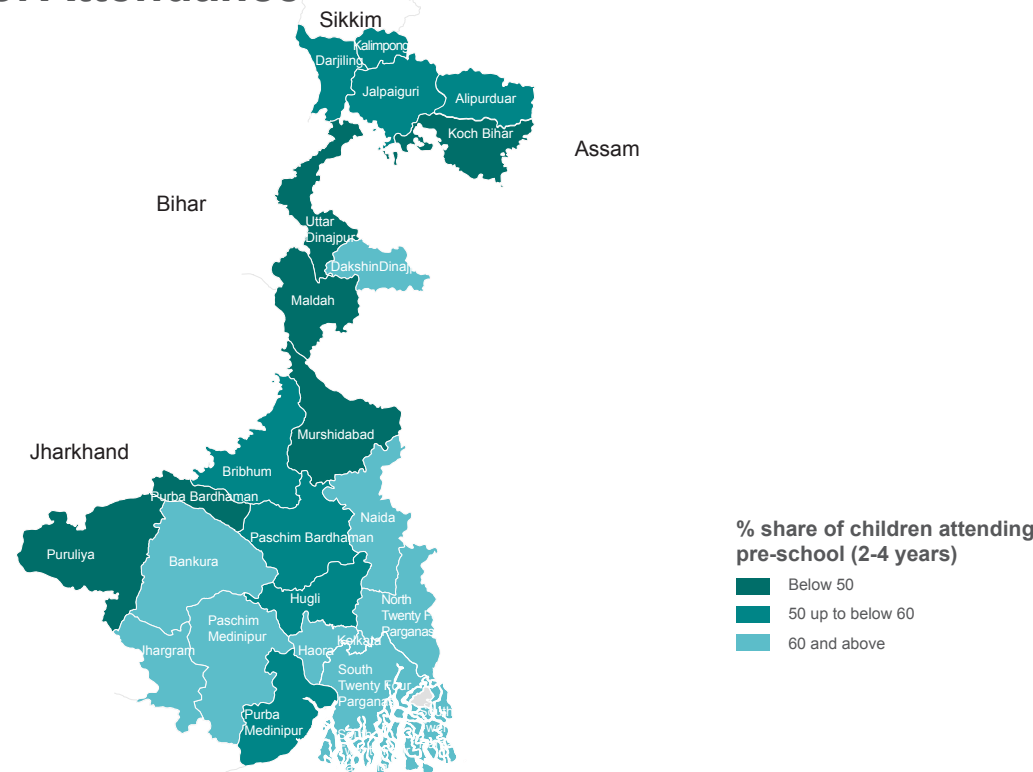

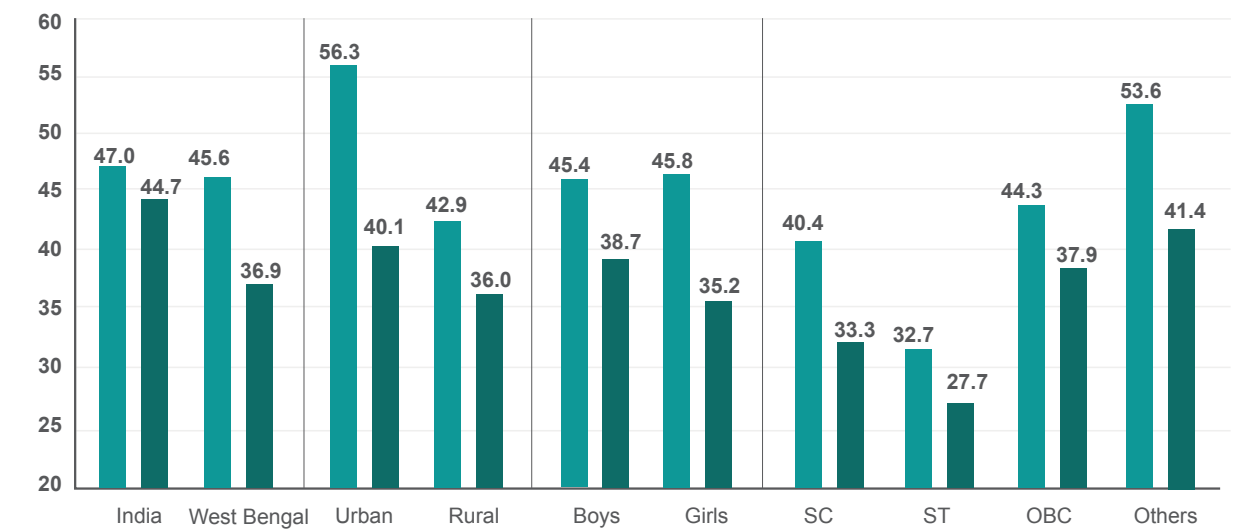

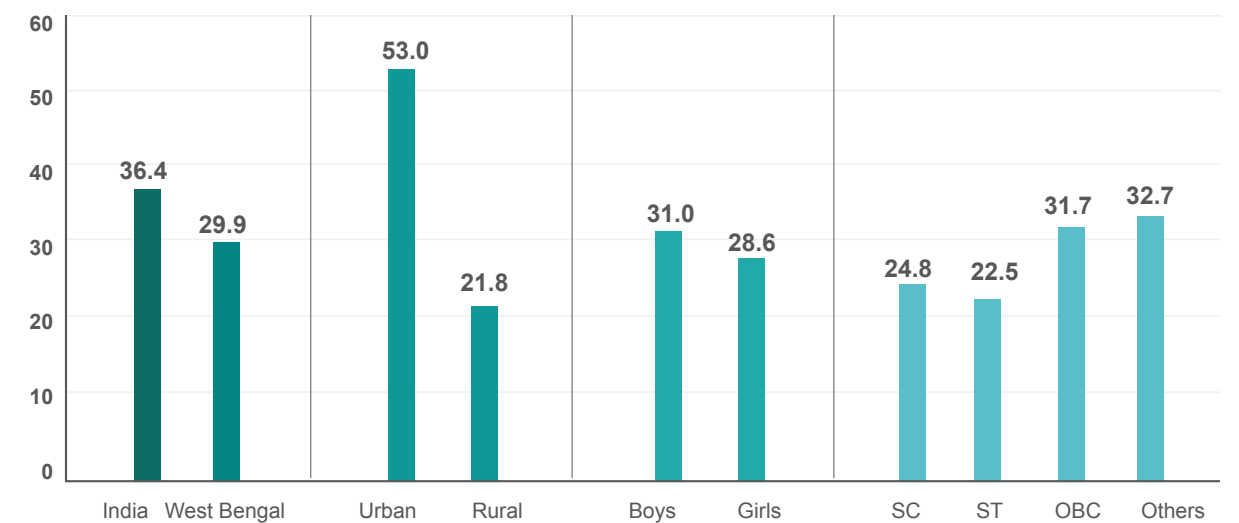

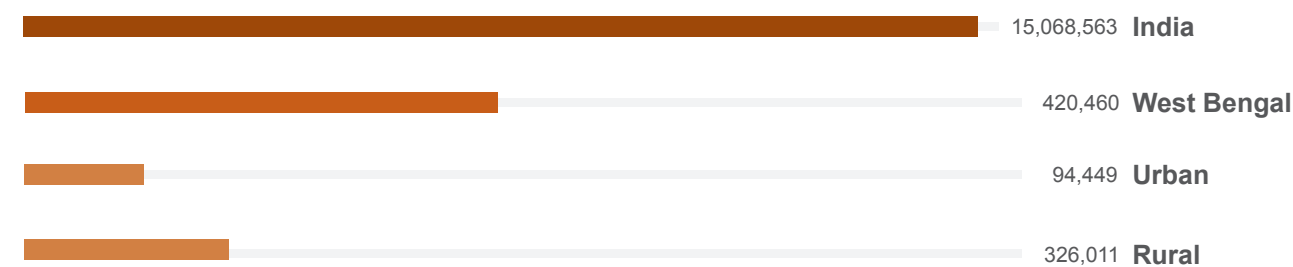

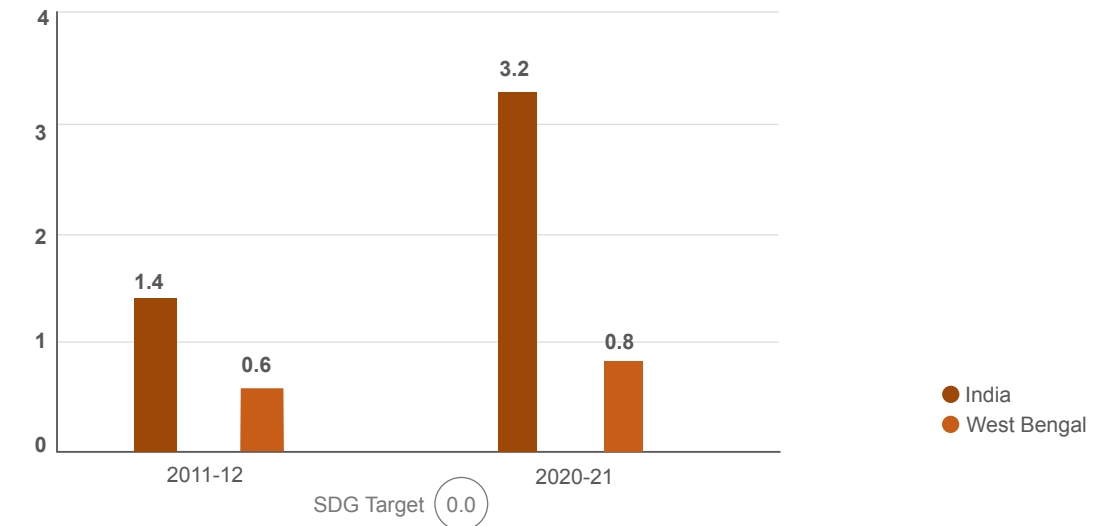

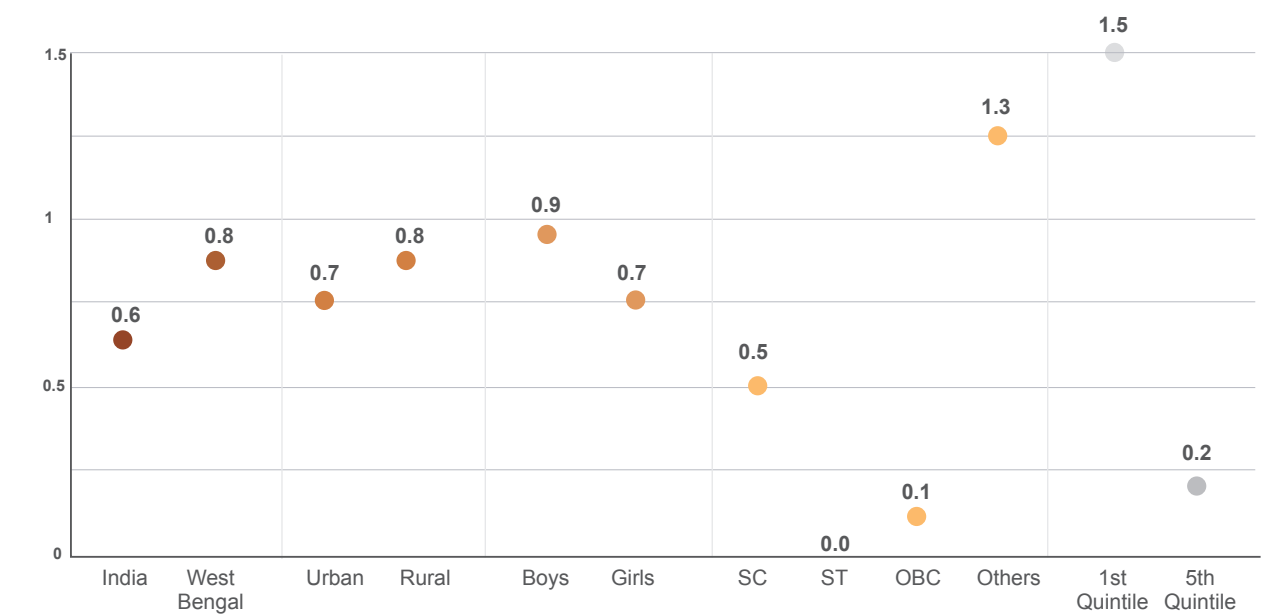
## Work Participation Rate (WPR) among Children (5-14 Years)

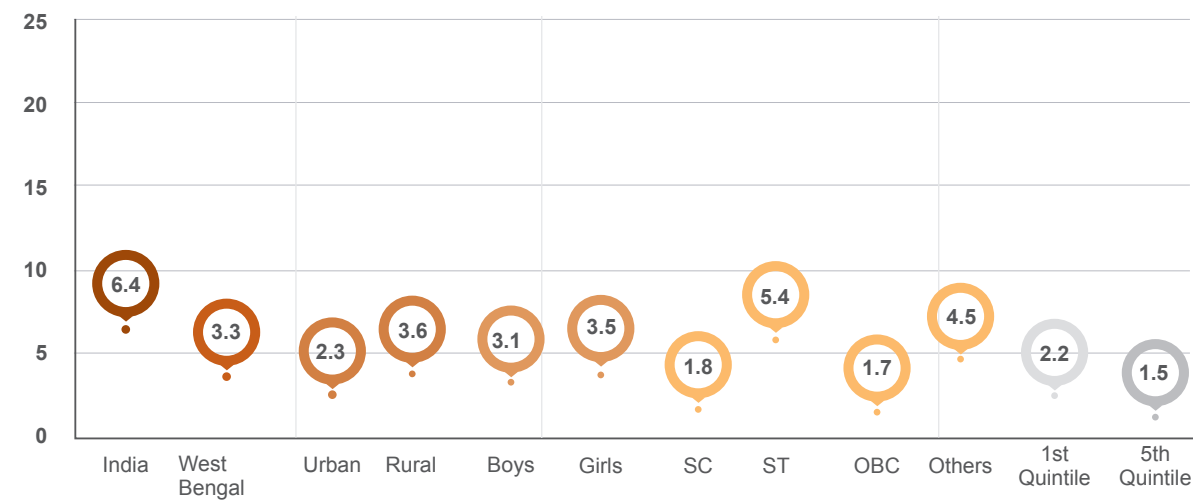

The share of children in the age group 5-14 years who are neither studying nor working by various levels of disaggregation

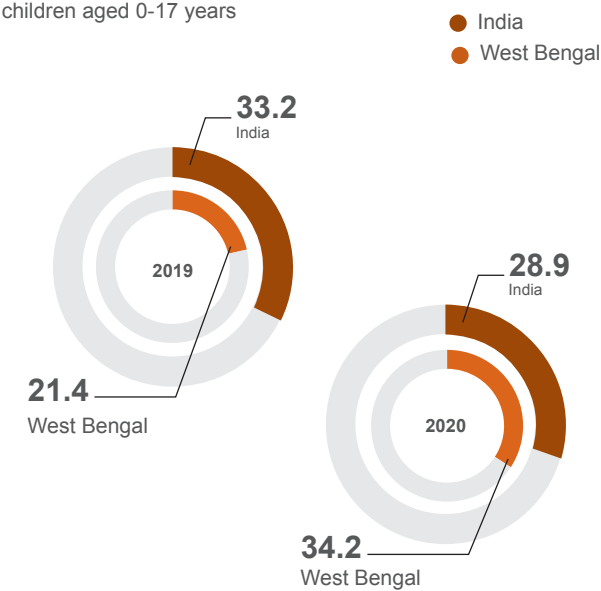

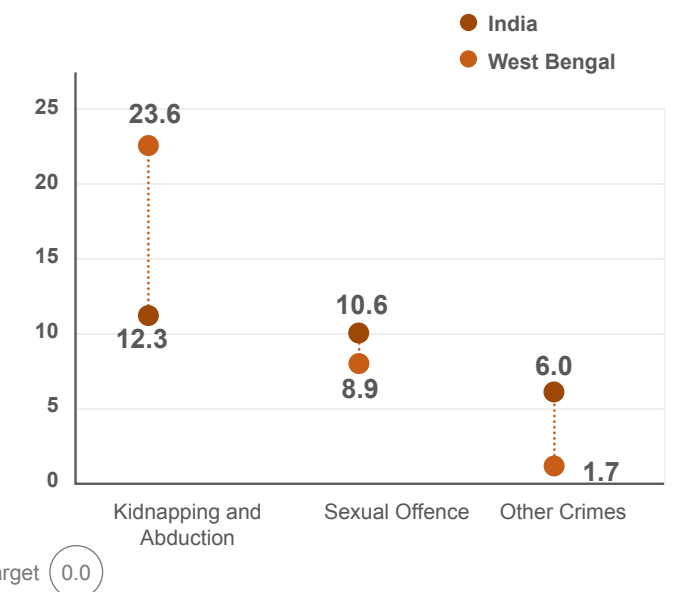

Number of crimes against children per 1,00,000 population of children aged 0-17 years



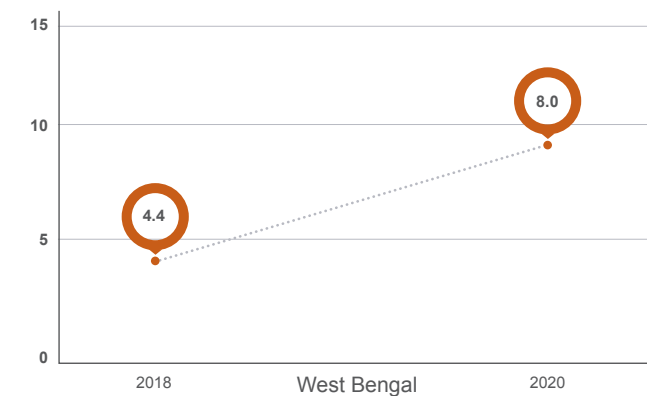

Share of children who were kidnapped and abducted, faced sexual offence or any other crimes etc.



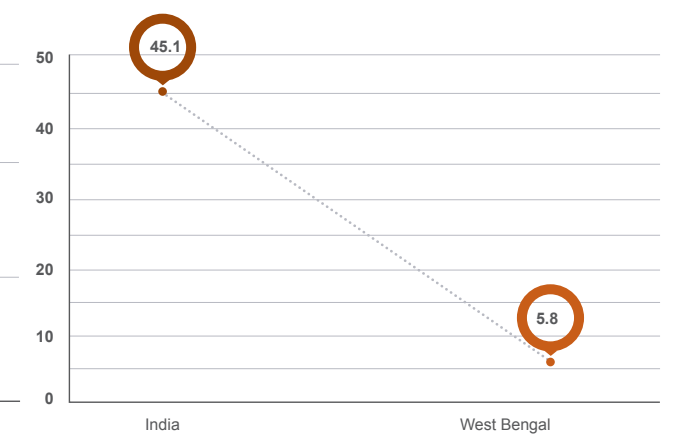
## State's Share of Total Crime against Children

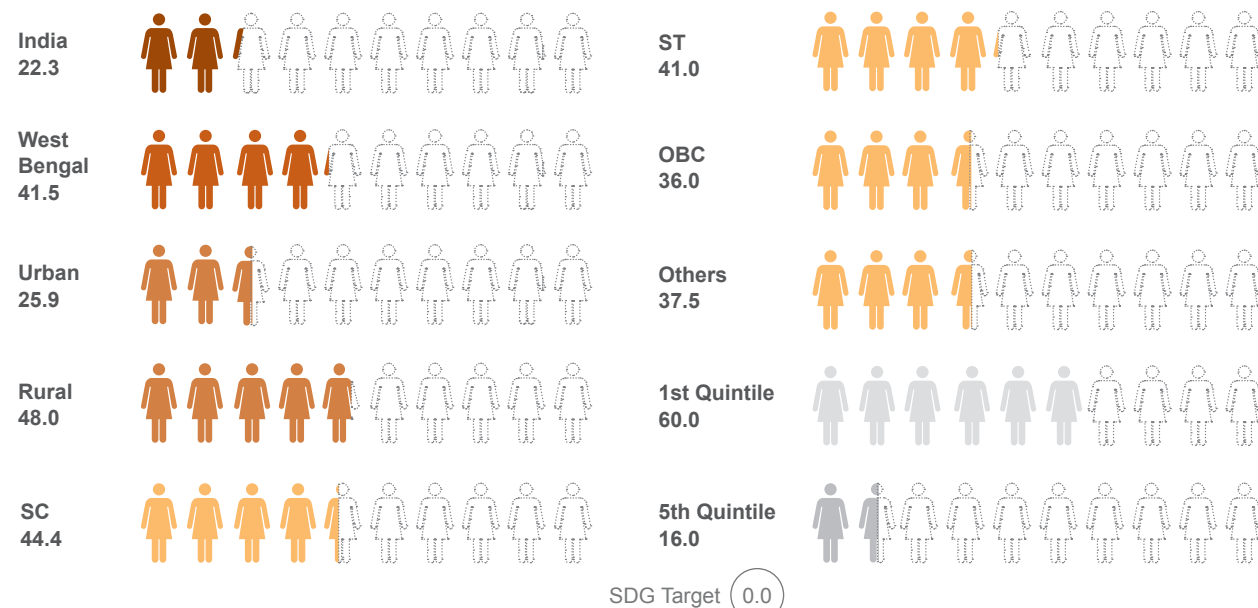

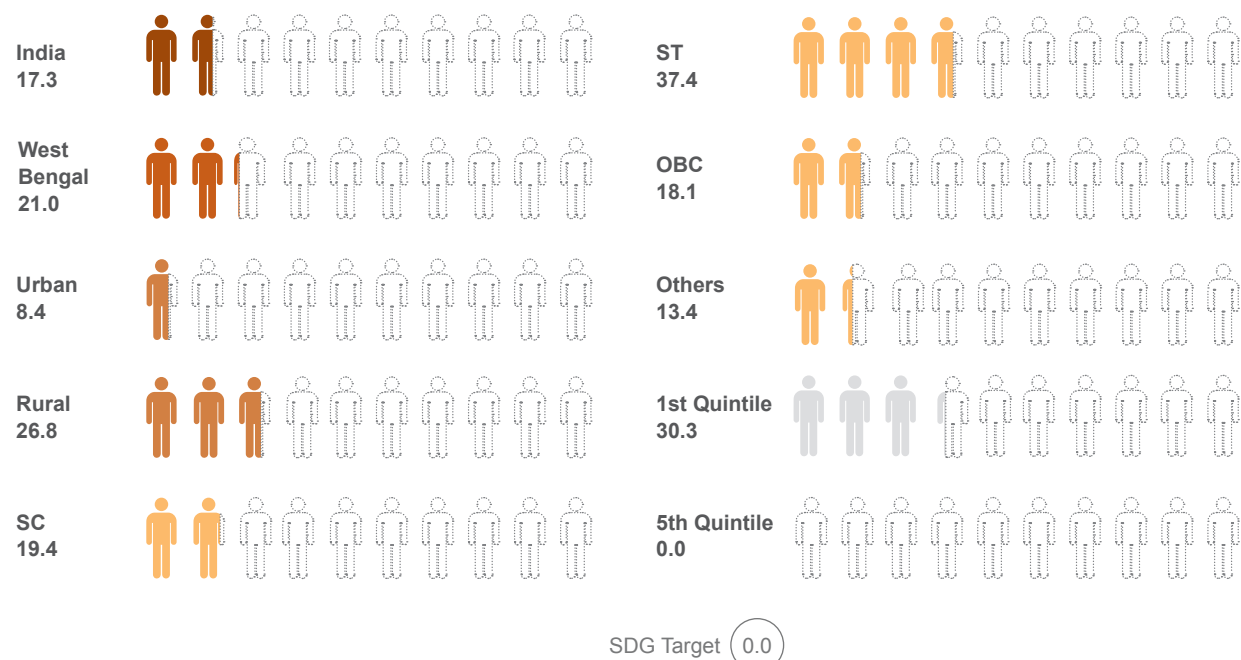

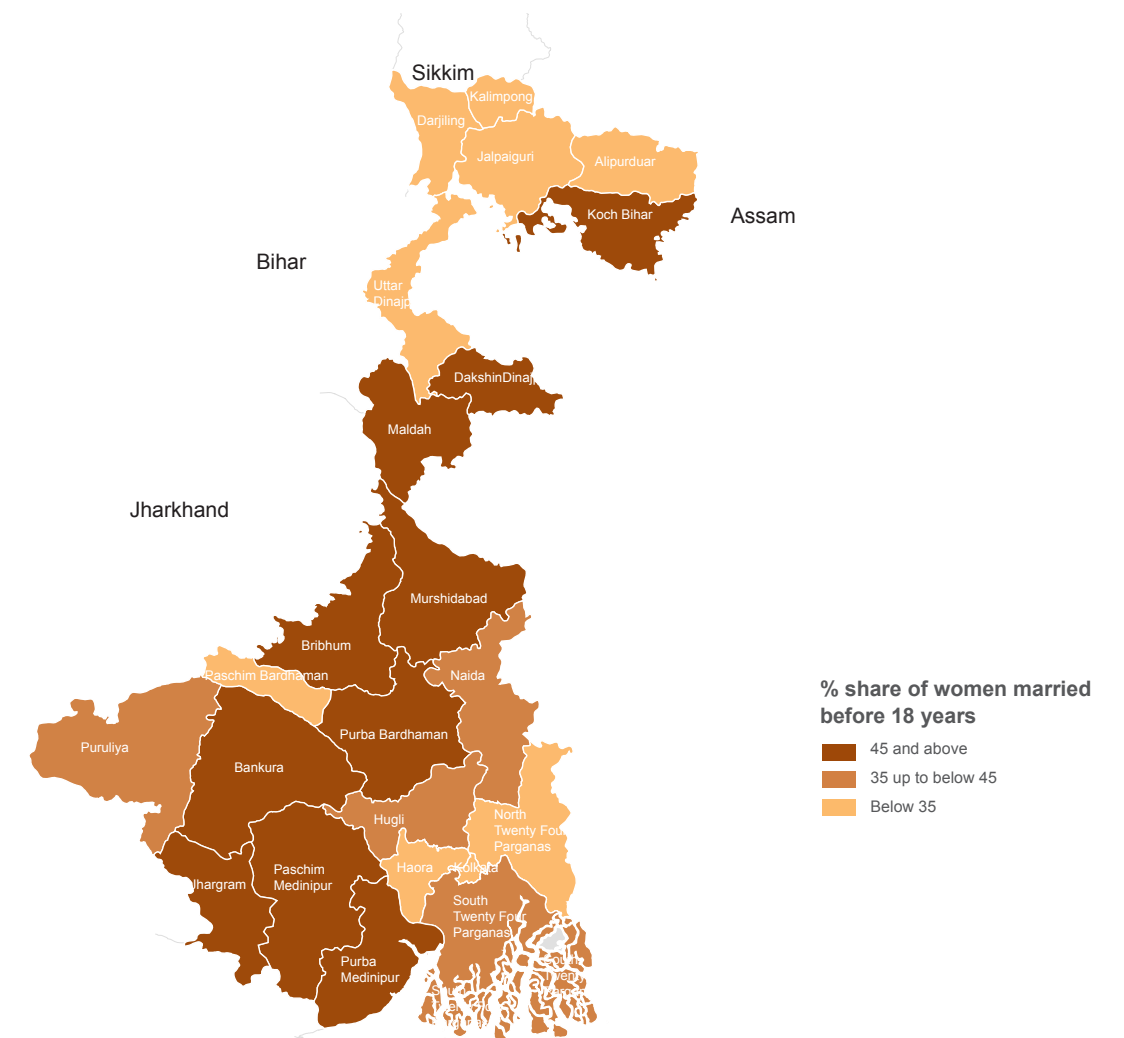

Percentage share of the population aged 15-64 years who are employed in an economically gainful activity both paid and unpaid during a reference period of 365 days before the survey

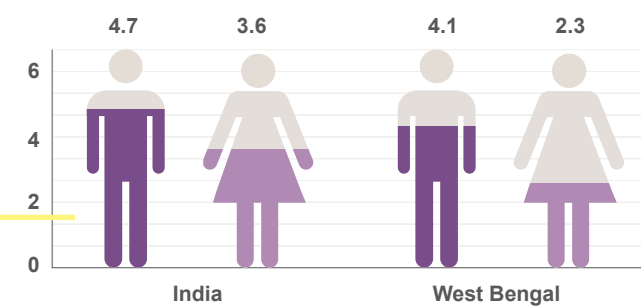


## Workforce Participation Rate for Women (15-64 Years)

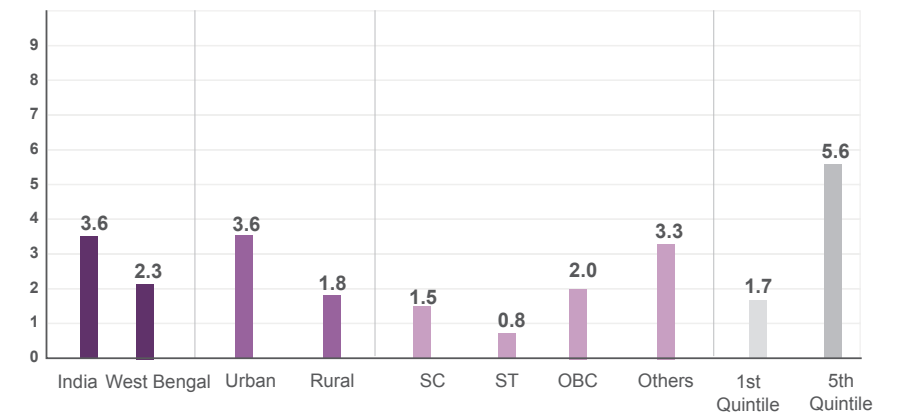
## Unemployment Rate (15-64 Years)

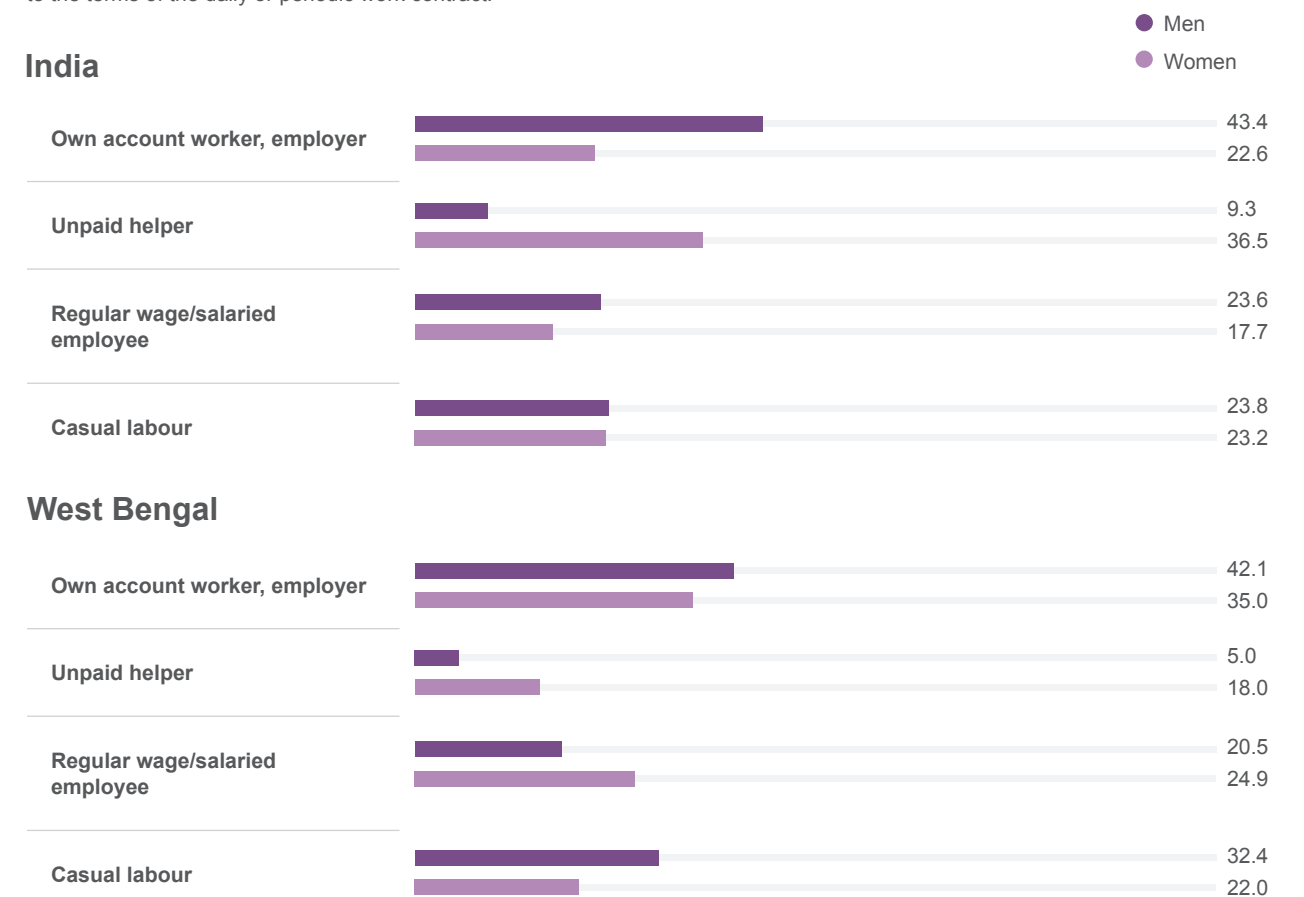
## Unemployment Rate for Women (15-64 years)

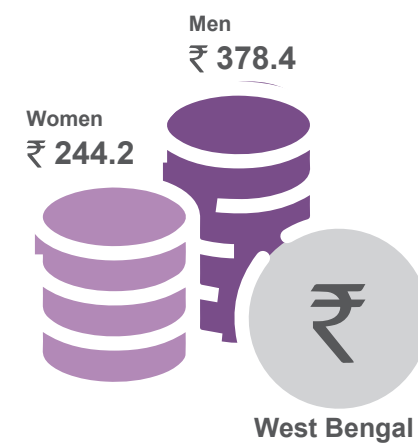
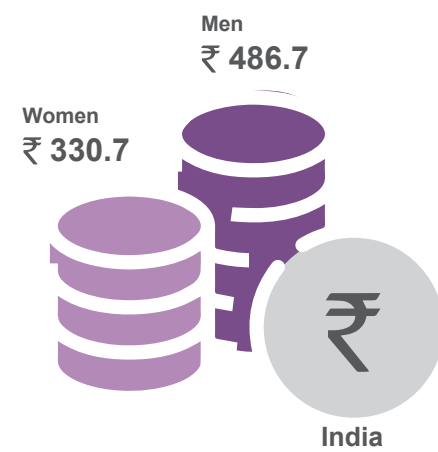
## Types of Employment

Distribution of workforce by usual status (reference period of 365 days) by different types of employment. Own-account workers and employers are those who operate their enterprises on their account. Unpaid helpers are those who work on family enterprises and do not receive any remuneration in return. Regular wage/salaried employees work in others' enterprises and receive salary on monthly or fortnightly basis. Casual labourers are those casually engaged in others' firm or non-firm enterprises and receive wages according to the terms of the daily or periodic work contract.



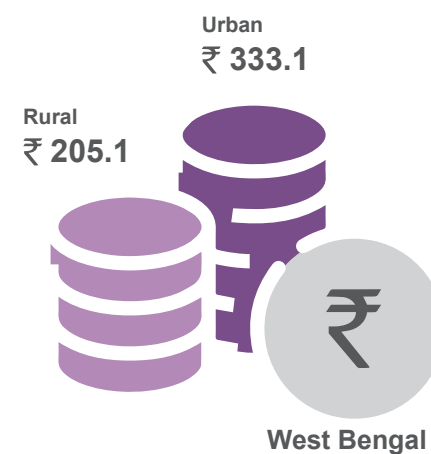
## Average Daily Salary/Wages (in INR)

Mathematical "mean" of the salaries per day for women employed in regular salaried workers and casual wage labourers by various levels of disaggregation

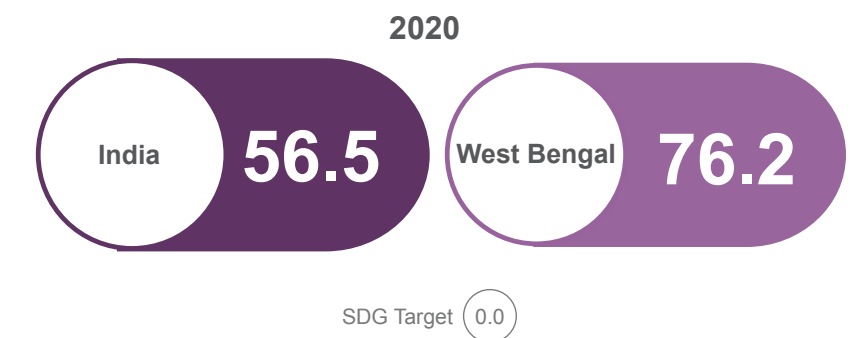

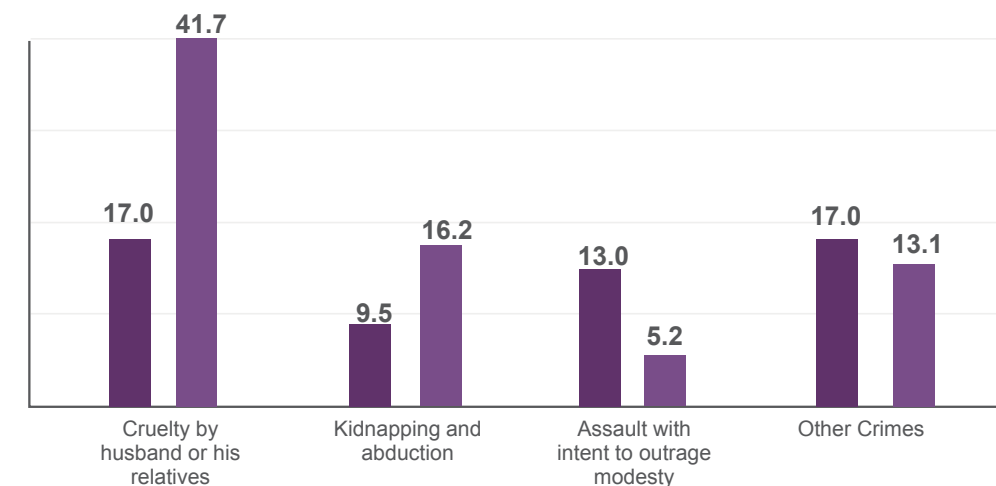

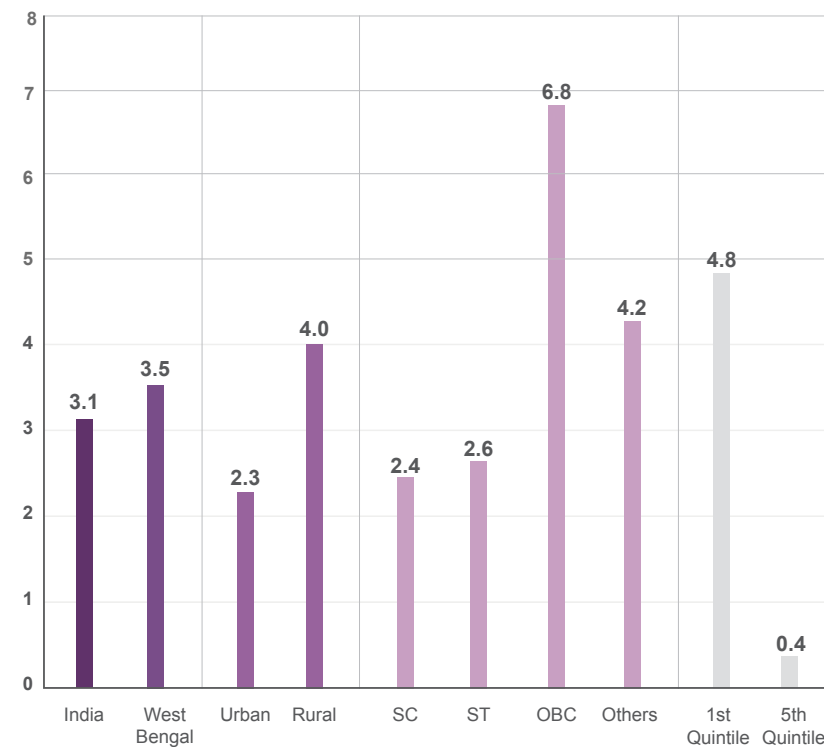
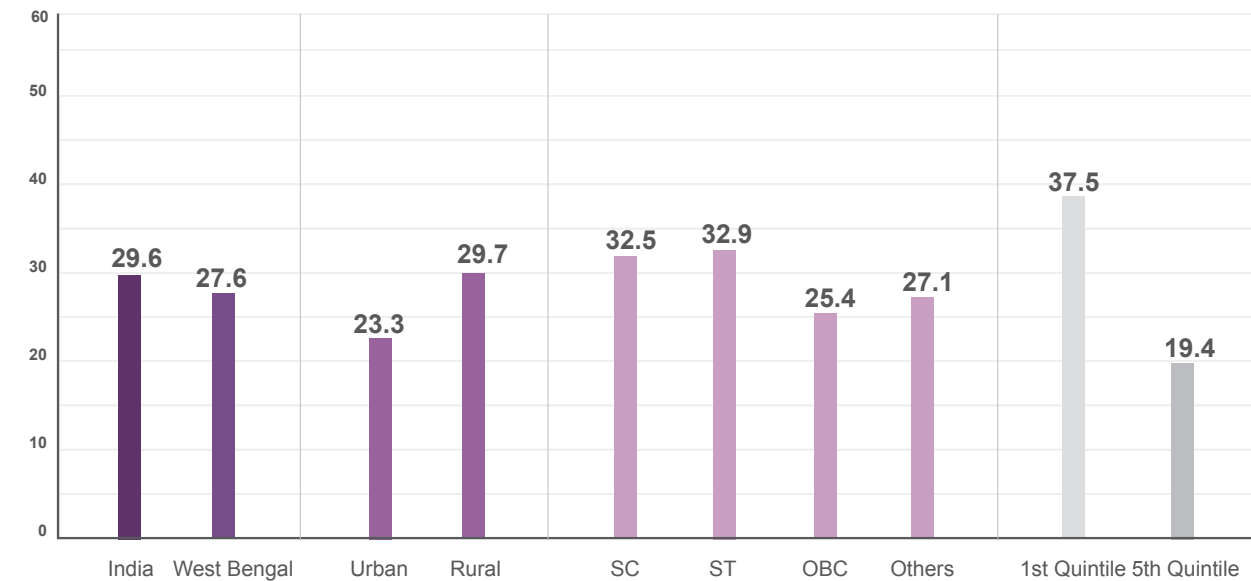

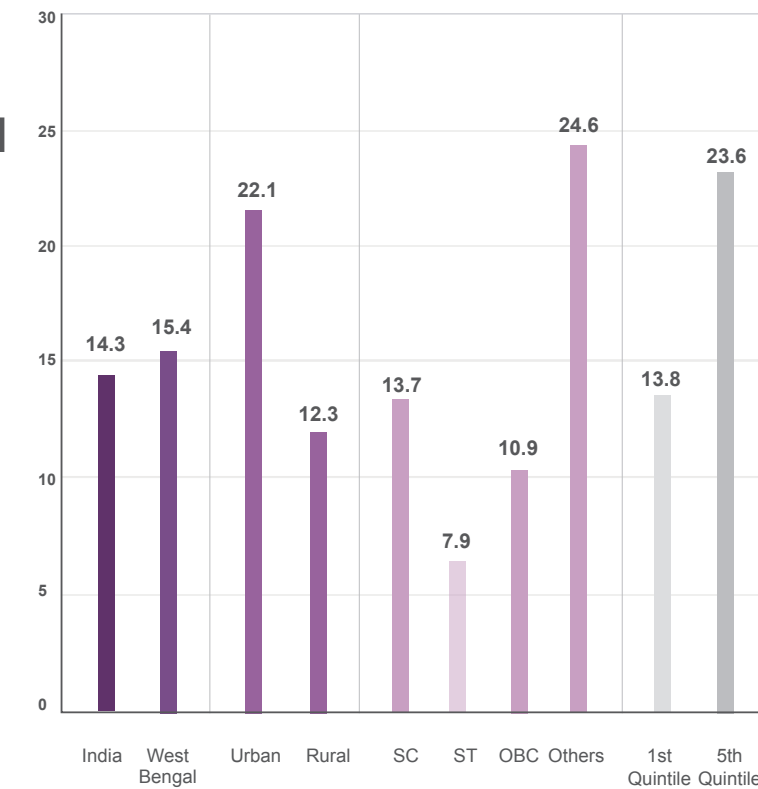

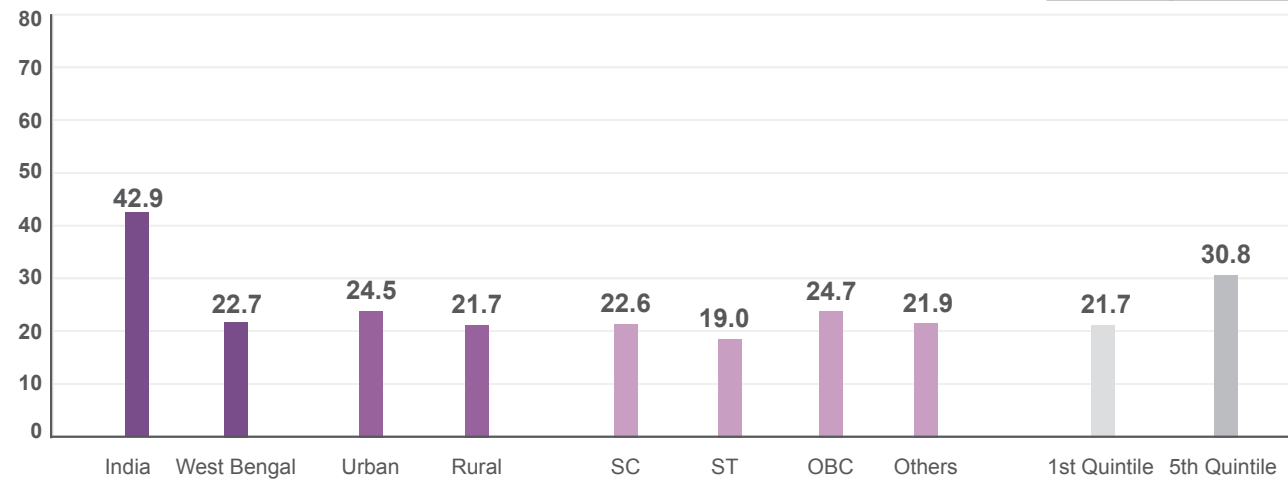

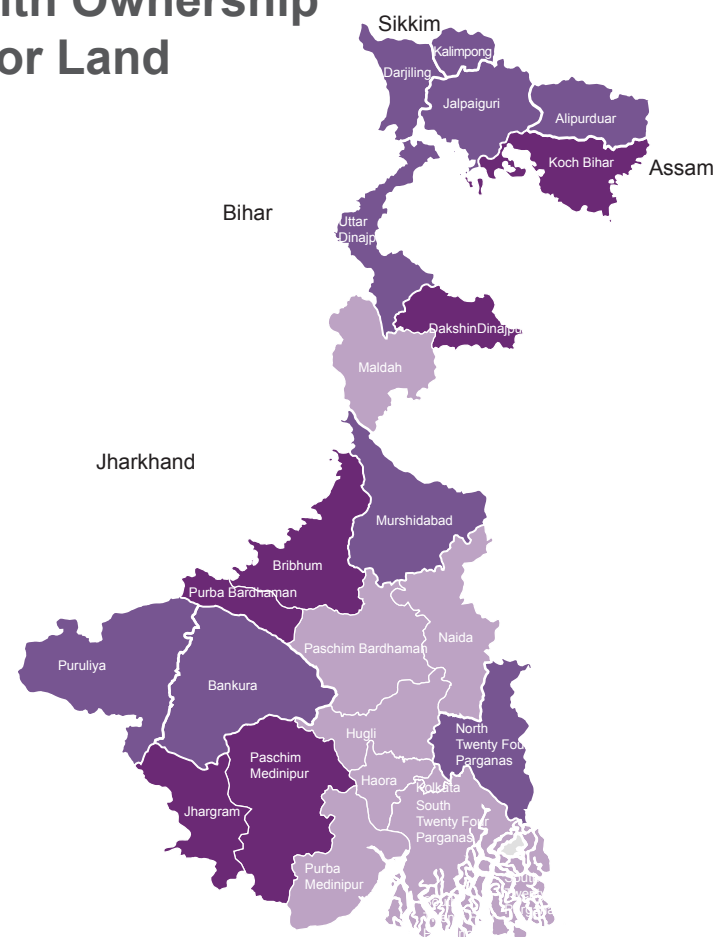

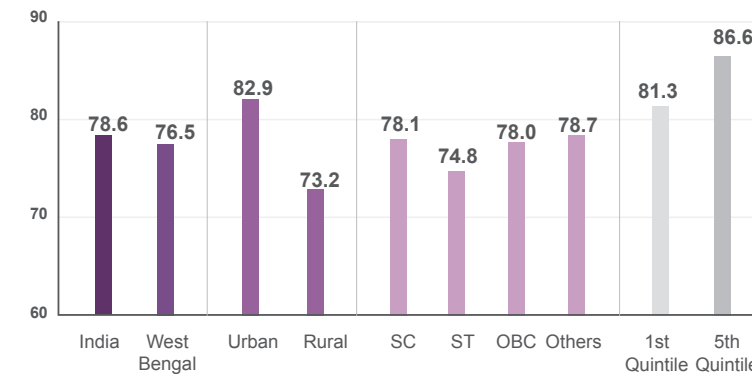

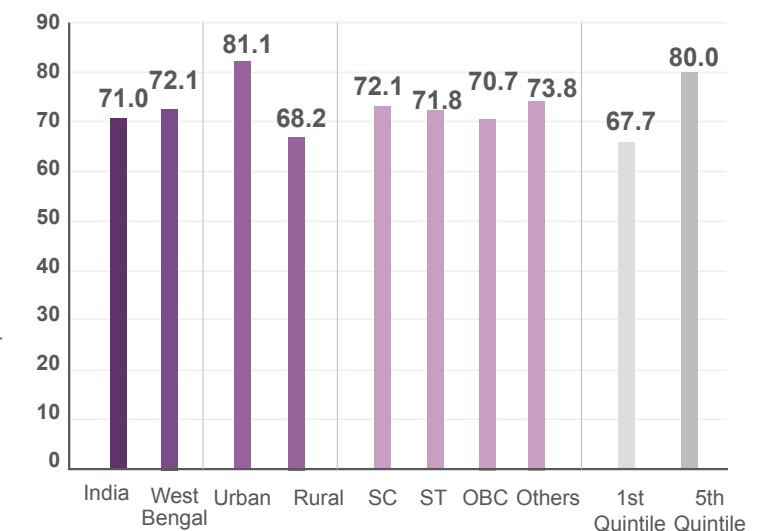

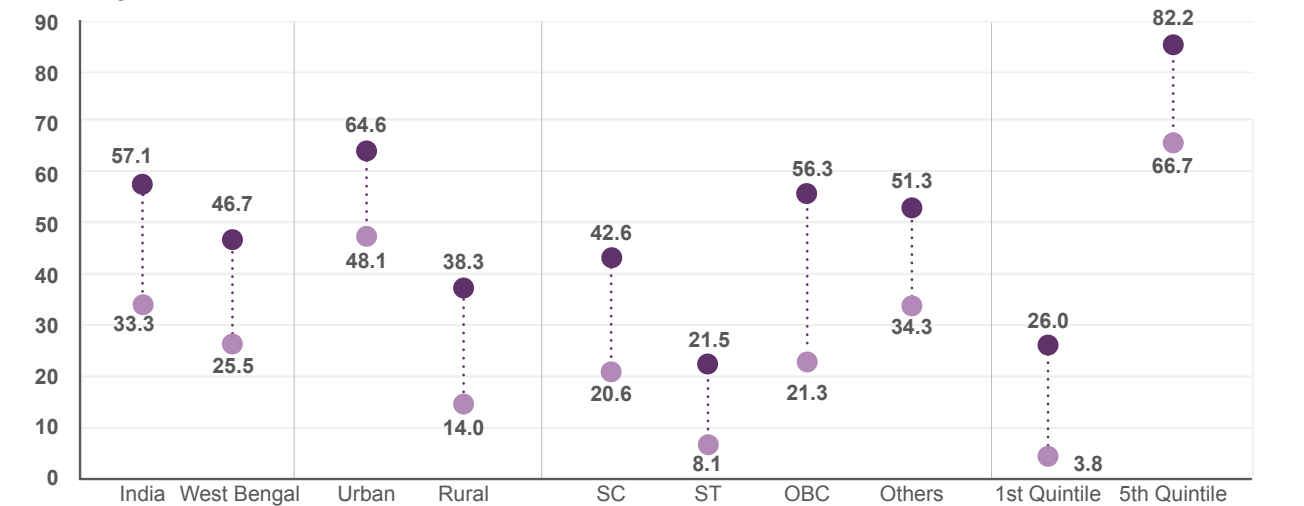

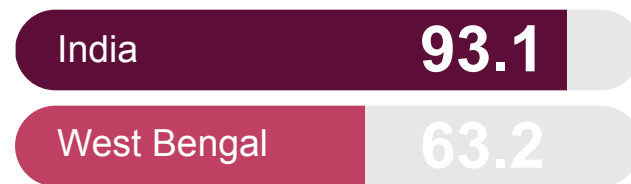

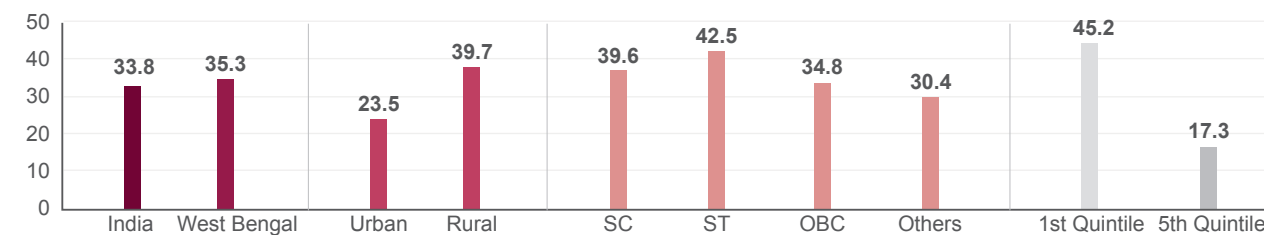

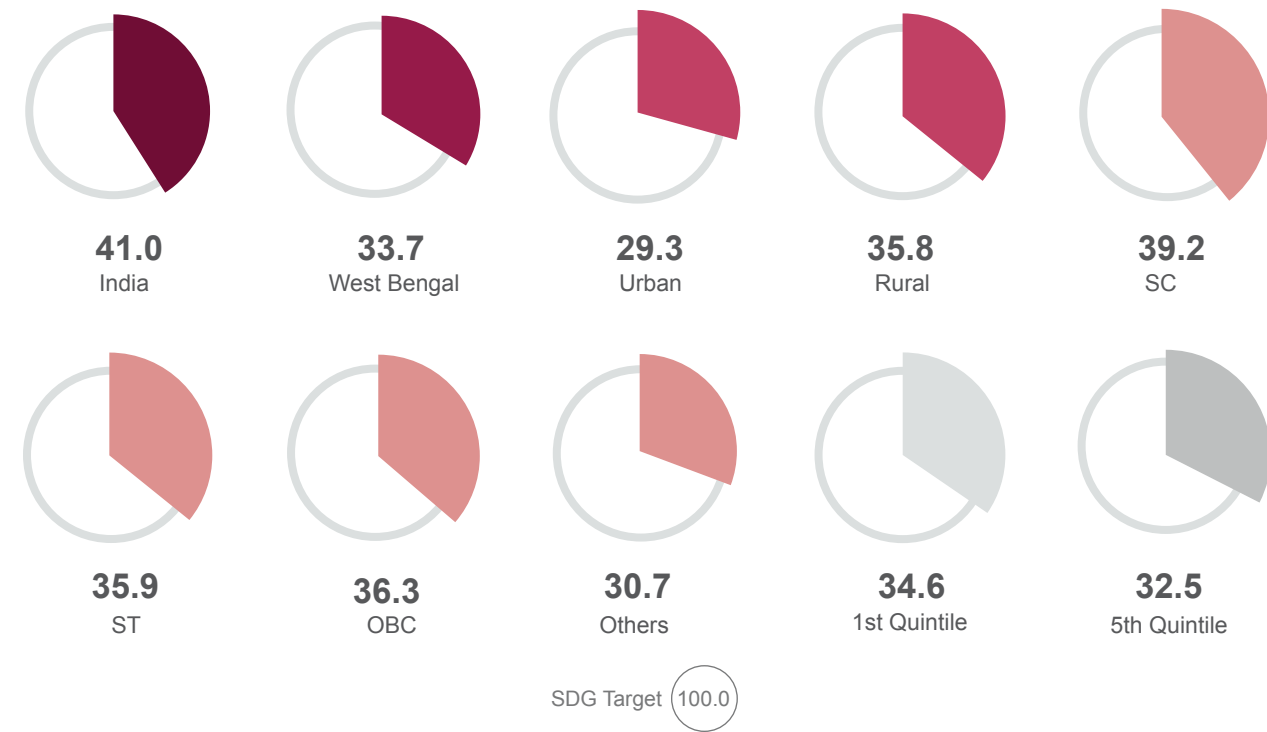

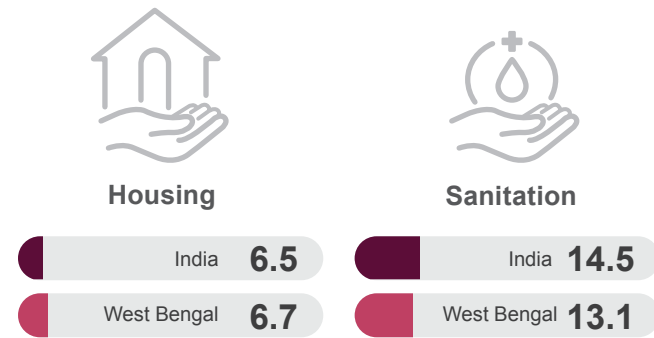

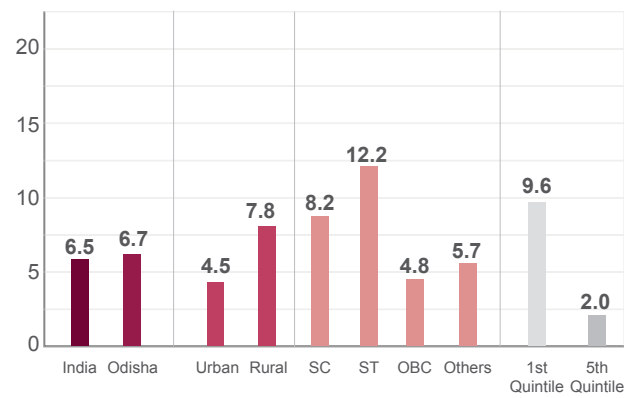

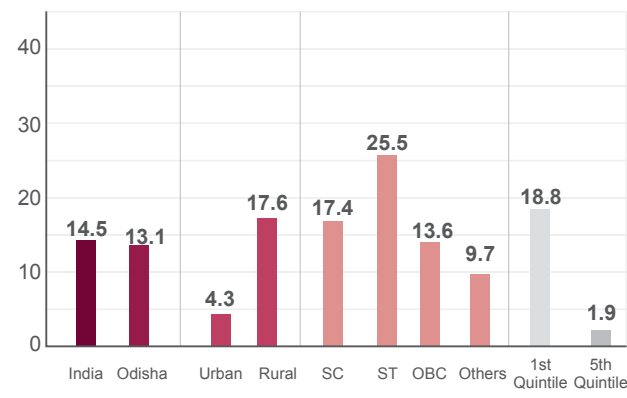
Percentage share of households that received benefits under the housing (Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana) and sanitation (Swachh Bharat Mission) government schemes

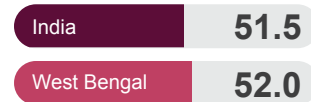

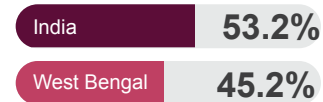
